Red Wolf

The red wolf, also known as the Florida wolf or Mississippi Valley wolf. *Is* canid of unresolved taxonomic identity native to the Easten United States. It is generally, porphologically, an intermediate between the coyote and gray wolf, and is of a reddish, tawny color. The red wolf is a federally listed endandered species of the United States, and is protected by law. It has been listed by LUSN as a criticaly endangered species since 1996.

• The red wolf lives and hunts in packs of 5-12 individuals (sometimes more), apparently unifying animals of several generations. Relations within the pack are usually non-aggressive. He hunts mainly during the day, pursuing the victim for a long time. Extraction varies from rodents and lizards to deer (zambar, axis) and antelope (nilgau, garna). Unlike many dogs, red wolves kill game,
