# WILL

- **Use of *will* Future**
- a spontaneous decision example: Wait, I will help you.
- an opinion, hope, uncertainty or assumption regarding the future example: He will probably come back tomorrow.
- a promise example: I will not watch TV tonight.
- an action in the future that cannot be influenced example: It will rain tomorrow.
- conditional clauses type I example: If I arrive late, I will call you.

# Signal Words

- in a year, next ..., tomorrow
- Vermutung: I think, probably, perhaps

# Form of *will* Future

Positive	I will speak English
Negative	I will not/won' talk to her
Question	Will you go to the party?
SHORT ANSWER	Yes, I will No, I won't

# BE GOING TO

- **Use of *going to* Future**
- an action in the near future that has already been planned or prepared example: I *am going to study* harder next year.
- a conclusion regarding the immediate future example: The sky is absolutely dark. It *is going to rain*.

# Signal Words

- in one year, next week, tomorrow

# FORM OF BE GOING TO

	positive	negative	question
<b>I</b>	I am going to speak.	I am not going to speak.	Am I going to speak?
<b>you / we / they</b>	You are going to speak.	You are not going to speak.	Are you going to speak?
<b>he / she / it</b>	He is going to speak.	He is not going to speak.	Is he going to speak?
