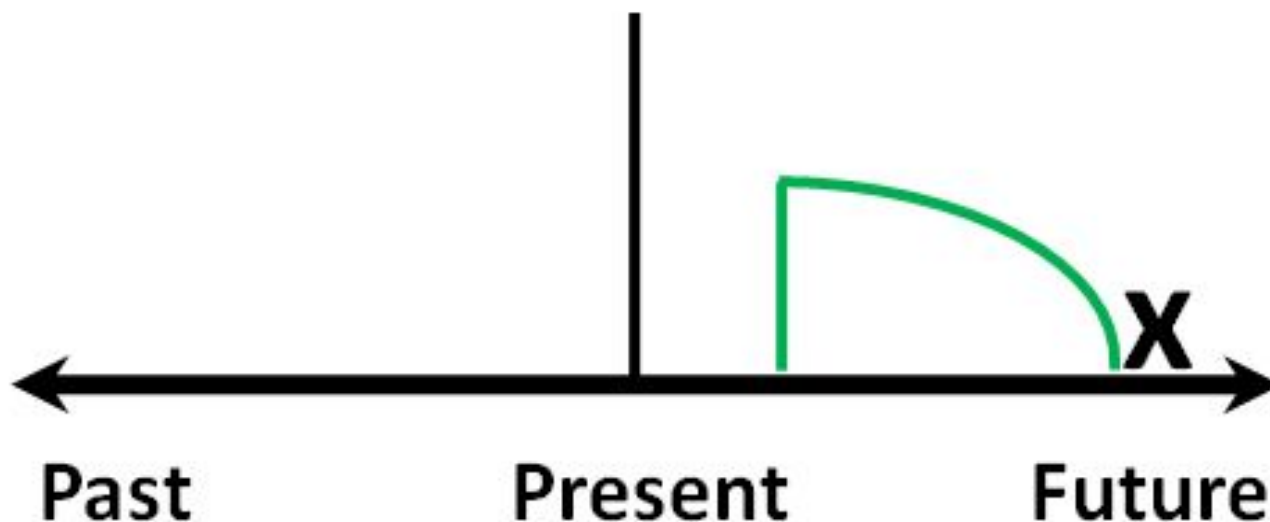

Future perfect continuous

Future Perfect Continuous

(will) + (have) + (been) + (present participle)

(am / is / are) + (going to) + (have) + (been) + (present participle)



Duration

- We use this tense to express situations that will last for a specified period of time at a definite moment in the future. It is important that we expect these situations to last longer.

Forming Future Perfect Continuous Tense

| | |
|--------------------------|--|
| Affirmative Form | Subject + will + have + been + verb(ing) When you graduate your university, I'll have been working as a dentist for 3 years |
| Negative Form | Subject + will not / won't + have + been + verb(ing) I won't have been treating patients by the time you arrive |
| Question Form | Will + subject + have + been + verb(ing)...? Will doctor Harry have been catering patients by the time I come? |
| Negative Question | Won't + subject + have + been + verb(ing) Won't you have been working as a private practitioner by 2025? |
