

Future perfect continuous



Duration

• We use this tense to express situations that will last for a specified period of time at a definite moment in the future. It is important that we expect these situations to last longer.

Forming Future Perfect Continuous Tense

Affirmative Form	Subject + will + have + been + verb(ing) When you graduate your university, I'll have been working as a dentist for 3 years
Negative Form	Subject + will not / won't + have + been + verb(ing) I won't have been treating patients by the time you arrive
Question Form	Will + subject + have + been + verb(ing)? Will doctor Harry have been catering patients by the time I come?
Negative Question	Won't + subject + have + been + verb(ing) Won't you have been working as a private practitioner by 2025?
