- January 22, 1963 the signing of the Élysée Treaty _____ a new era in French-German relations
- knowledge of each other's language
- importance of cultural exchanges between the two countries

40th anniversary of the Élysée Treaty

- a prerequisite to a closer cooperation between Germany and France
- the two countries are each other's most important trade partner today
- Countries have succeeded in making friends out of enemies
- July 5, 1963 The Franco-German Youth Office (FGYO) goals: to reinforce the culture of the partner, motivate young people to learn the partner's language, and promote intercultural learning, among others
- the FGYO has enabled about eight million German and French youth to participate in 300,000 exchange programs
