Two years later, Luisa had made 13,000 Little Bundies. Prior to this, she had spent most weekends and holidays researching craft fairs across the south of England. At one fair she sold 250 figures in an hour at £2 a go. And she even researched the number of people that usually turned up to each fair, so she knew exactly the number she needed to make for the customers there. When she noticed that the majority of customers were buying the toys as gifts she designed a range of gift cards to accompany them.

At this point, the volume of work was becoming overwhelming and she decided to seek advice from Sir Richard Branson, who had begun his Virgin empire as a teenager. On his advice she set up Bundy Creations Ltd, with her mother as director.

Q What do a lot of successful inventors share?

A They all started their businesses when they were teenagers.

The Young Designers Competition encourages students aged from 13 to 16 to design new, exciting things.

The competition started in 2008 and more than 4,000 teenagers enter it every year. Rose Steadman organises the competition. 'I have a fantastic job. Every year, I meet a lot of very clever teenagers with great ideas. For example, last year, a girl in Norfolk made a solar powered cold bag for food. The year before, a boy from Devon designed a recycled wood toy box for young children.'

The first winner was Jason Owen. In 2009, when he was fourteen, Jason designed and made a picnic bag – for a dog! Jason explained where his idea

came from. 'My dad can't see so he has a guide dog. I made the first bag with denim from some old jeans but now they are nylon – it's easier to clean. I designed them for working dogs but now people buy them for their family pets. It was really exciting when I won. It gave me a lot of confidence and the prize money was very useful! I used it to advertise the pet picnic bag.'

Lola Bennett was the winner in 2010. She wanted to practise speaking Spanish but she was worried about just looking on the Internet and using social networking sites. Her answer to the problem? She designed a language exchange website for students all over the world. Lola says, 'I started the website when I was fourteen and now there are 750,000 members. I designed it for students aged thirteen to sixteen and it's a safe social networking site.'

Brother and sister Leanne and Jacob Nelson also invented something to solve a problem. Their great-grandmother couldn't use a computer mouse because her hands were too old. 'The mouse was very uncomfortable for her. It was too small. We designed a cover so she could use it easily. We made it with some foam from an old bed. A computer company bought the idea from us a year ago. Now we're thinking about what we can do next to help her and other old people use technology.'

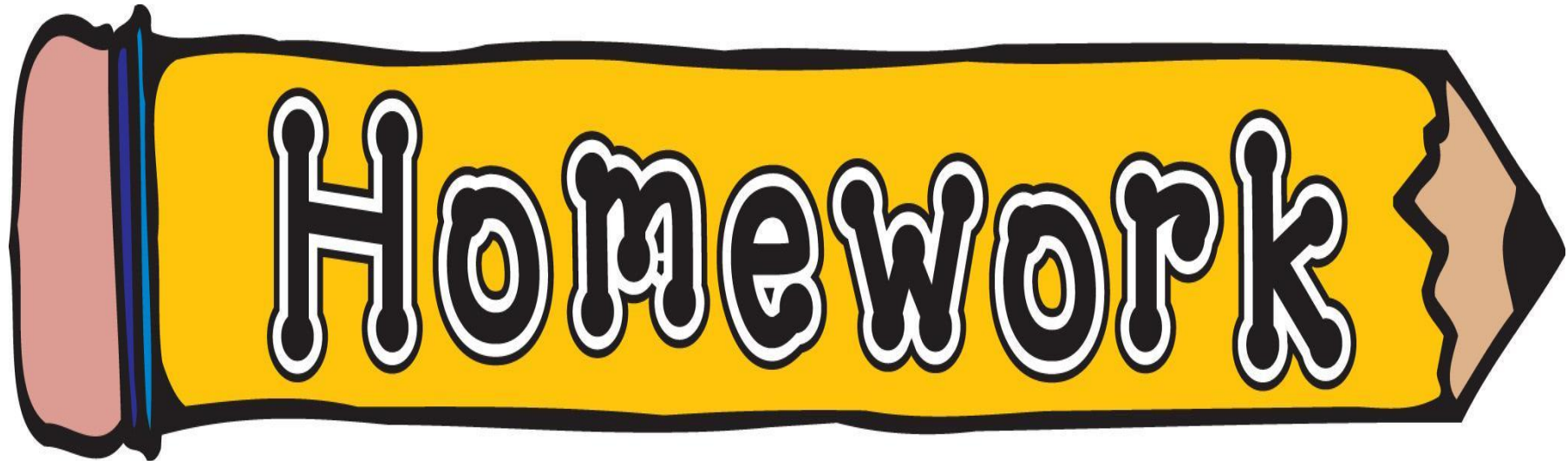
