went into hospital

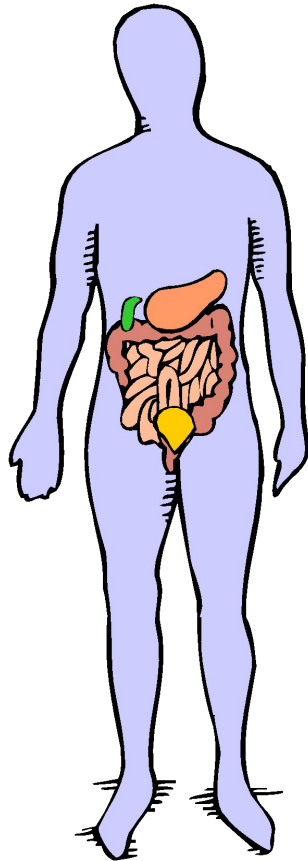
- They were Dirty

- She was 30 when her parents let her go to Germany and Paris to study nursing

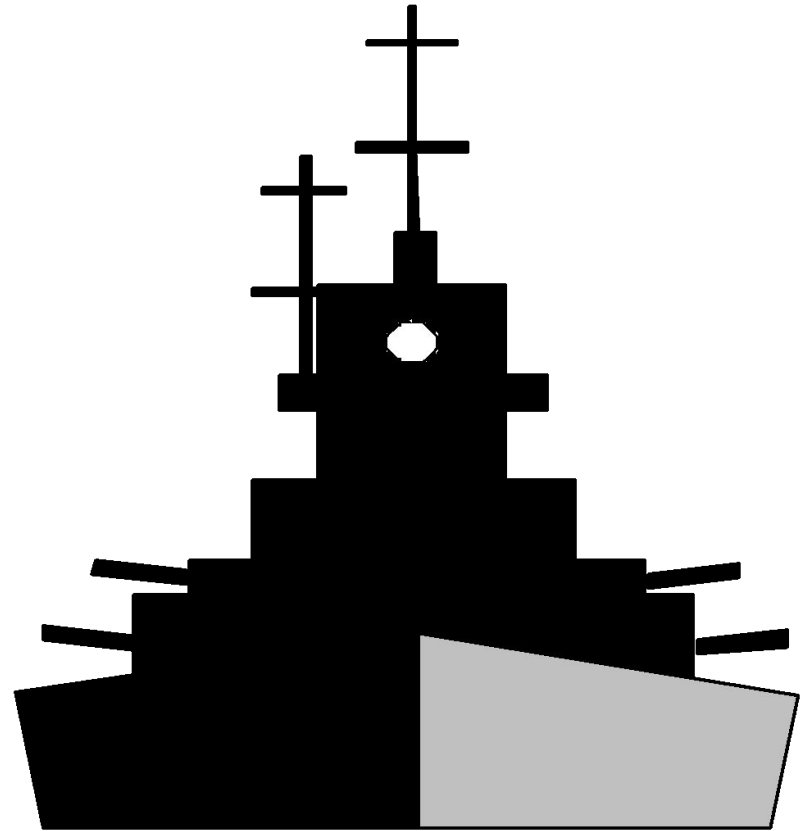
Crimean War

- Broke out when Florence 34 was years old
- War Russia v Turkey(Britain and France)
- Reports were coming through about terrible conditions in hospitals



Florence leaves London
