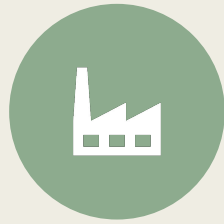

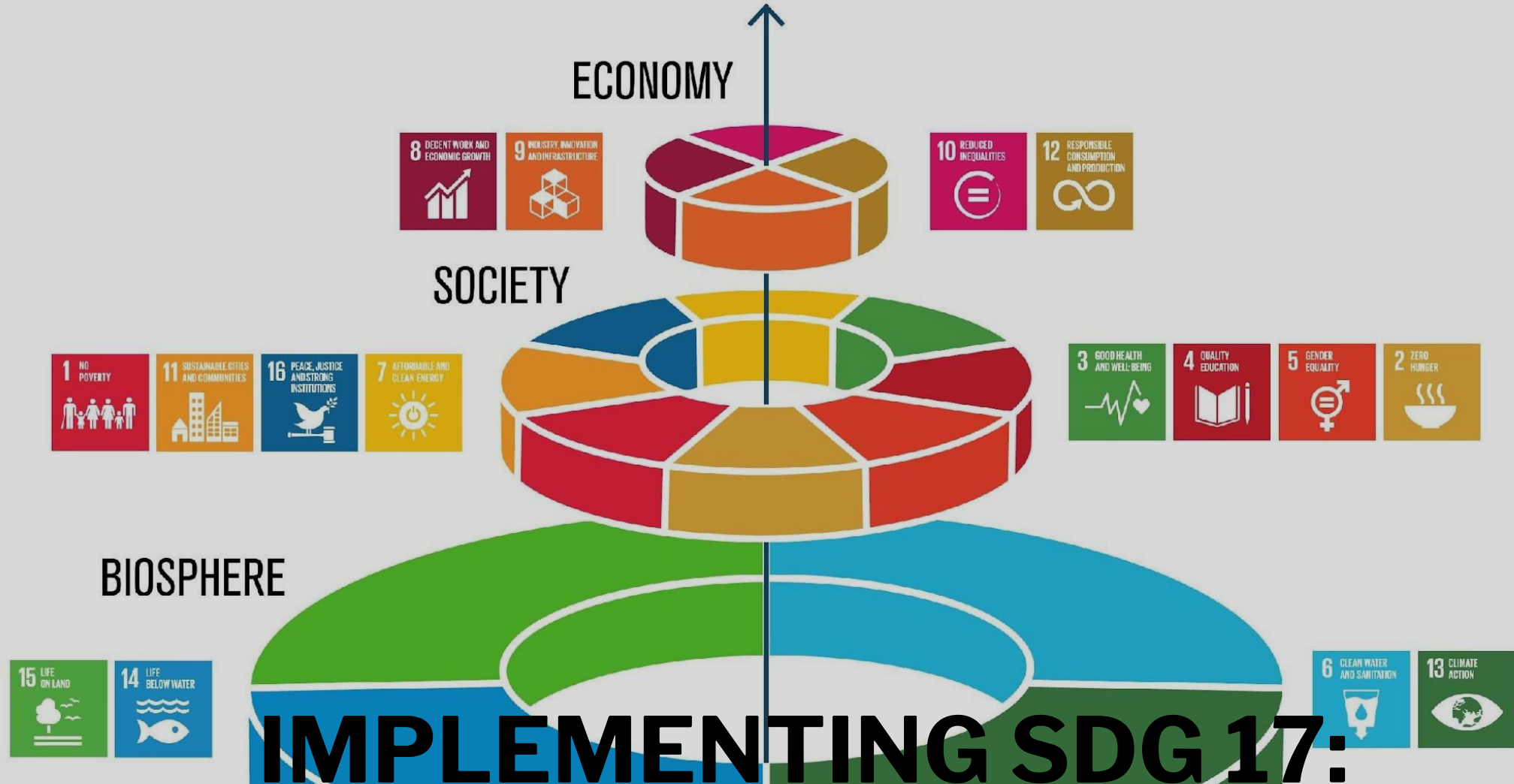

REVITALIZE THE GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



POWER REFERS BROADLY TO THE EXTENT THAT CERTAIN ACTORS CAN PURSUE AND ACHIEVE THEIR INTERESTS, OFTEN THROUGH INFLUENCING OTHER ACTORS TO ACT IN THE WAY DESIRED BY THE FIRST ACTORS.
