

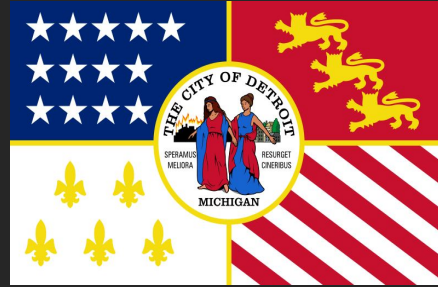

History



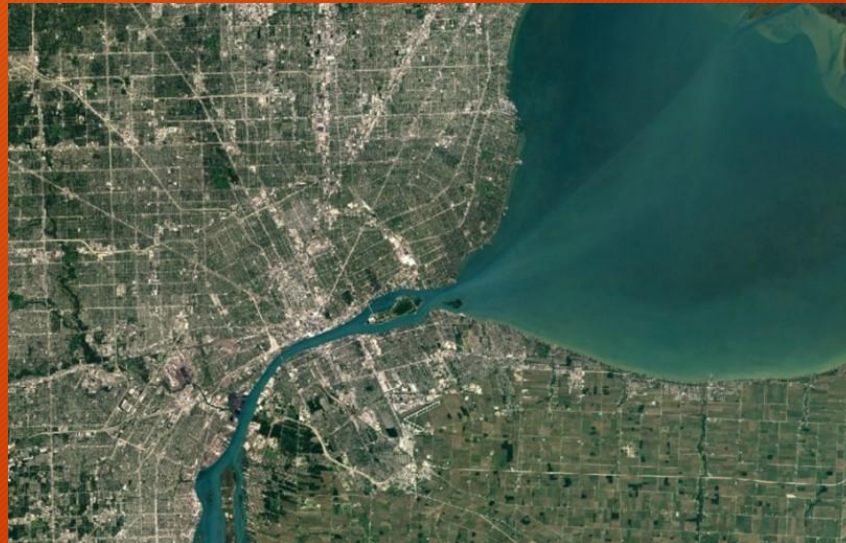
**Michigan

- In 1760, Montreal and Detroit became a British colony.
- Detroit remained a canadian town for a long time and moved to the United States only in 1796.
- Detroit received city status in 1815.
- The official language is English.

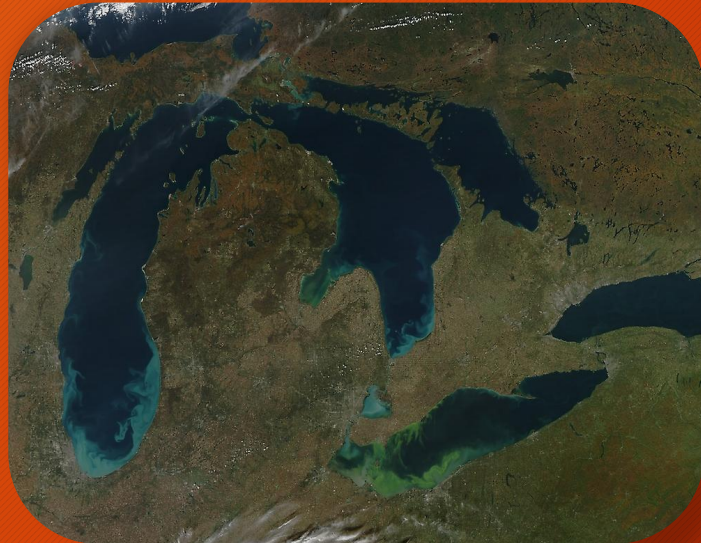
The population

Climatic features of the city

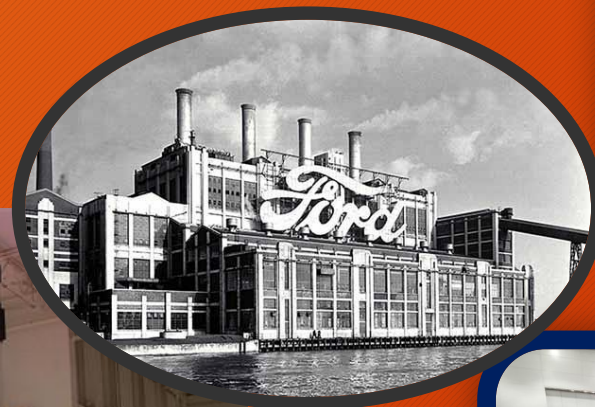
- **The humid climate of Detroit is greatly influenced by the nearby great Lakes.**
