MONUMENT TO NIKOLAI PILYUGIN

took place on May 19, 2008.
Installed on the street that
bears his name.

MONUMENT TO KLIMENT TIMIRYAZEY



Monument to Timiryazev is a monument to natural scientist, plant physiology specialist Kliment Timiryazev. The monument was erected in 1923 in Moscow on Tverskoy Boulevard near Nikitskiye Vorota Square.

MONUMENT TO ANDREI SAKHAROV



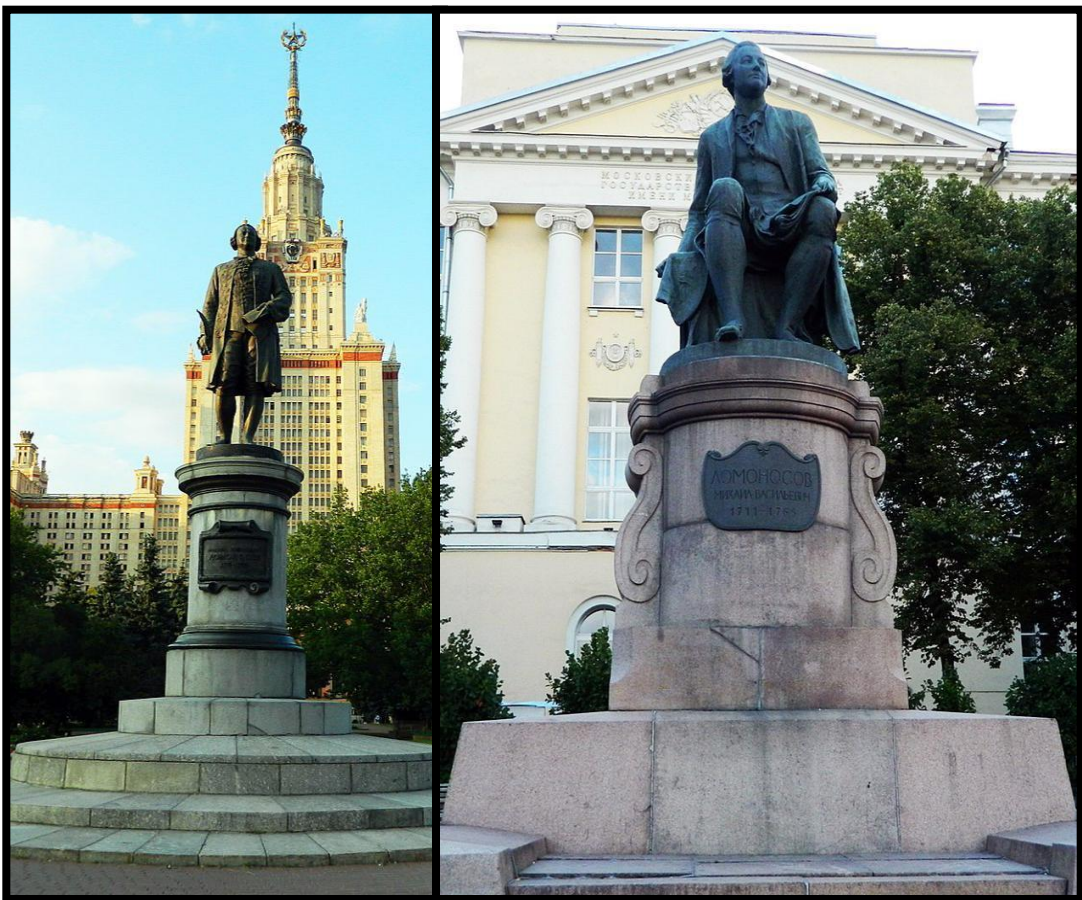
Monument to Andrei Sakharov in St. Petersburg is located on the square of the same name on Vasilevsky Island, near St. Petersburg State University. Andrei Sakharov was an outstanding scientist in the field of theoretical physics, one of the authors of Soviet thermonuclear technology, but also went down in history as a dissident and human rights activist.

MONUMENTS TO MENDELEEV



Several monuments are erected to many of the most famous scientists: a monument to the Russian chemist D.I.Mendeleev. Located in St. Petersburg near the building of the Chamber of Measures is a monument to the Russian chemist D.I.Mendeleev. Located in St. Petersburg near the building of the Chamber of Weights and Measures on Moskovsky Prospekt and in Tobolsk, it is located in the Nagornaya part of the city on the territory of the 6th microdistrict, at the intersection of Mendeleev Avenue and Komsomolsky Prospekt.

MONUMENTS TO LOMONOSOV



The first, the Monument to M.V. Lomonosov on the Sparrow Hills of Moscow, was installed next to the building of Moscow University on Lomonosov Square, and the second, on Mokhovaya Street in Moscow, was installed next to the building of the Faculty of Journalism of Moscow University in the Arbat area. The current monument to Lomonosov is the third in a row standing on this site.
