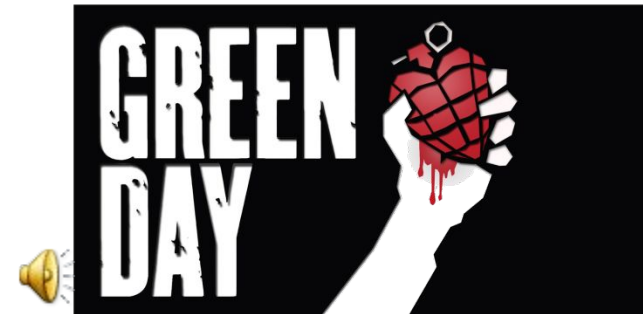

- "**Wake Me Up When September Ends**" is a song by American rock band [Green Day](#), released on June 13, 2005, as the fourth single from the group's seventh studio album, [American Idiot](#) (2004).
- "Wake Me Up When September Ends" was written by Green Day frontman Billie Joe Armstrong about his father, who died of cancer in September 1982 when Billie Joe was ten. Armstrong, at one point, dubbed the song the most autobiographical he had written to that point, considering it "therapeutic" but also difficult to perform.
- "Wake Me Up When September Ends" became closely associated with [Hurricane Katrina](#), which struck the [Gulf Coast](#) of the United States on August 29, 2005. "Wake Me Up When September Ends" became symbolic in the aftermath; one online blogger paired the song with television coverage of the disaster, creating a viral video. Green Day performed the song days after the disaster on [ReAct Now: Music & Relief](#), a [benefit concert](#) broadcast on [MTV](#) and its associated properties.
