

Jack the Ripper

a famous criminals



The ripper jack is a pseudonym assigned to an unidentified serial killer who operated in Whitechapel and surrounding areas of London in the second half of 1888.

Prostitutes from slums to which the murderer cut a throat before opening an abdominal cavity were the victims attributed to Jack the Ripper. Extraction of internals at least caused the assumption in three of the victims that the murderer has the certain anatomic knowledge peculiar to the professional surgeon.



Elisabeth Strayd, is killed on September 30, 1888. Strayd's body was found approximately in the first one o'clock in the morning, in Datfilds-yard on Berenr Street, it cut off an ear lobe, according to a promise of the Eviscerator.

Catherine Eddous, is killed on September 30, 1888 in one day with other victim, Elisabeth Strayd. The body Keith Eddous is found on Mitr-Skuer at 1:45 in the night.

Mary Jane Kelly, was born in Ireland in 1863, is killed on November 9, 1888. Mary Kelly's corpse spoiled to unrecognizability was found in her own room at 10:45 in the morning.

Letters from the Ripper

During the investigation of the Ripper case, the police, newspapers and representatives of other organizations received thousands of letters concerning the Ripper case in one way or another. Sometimes they contained carefully thought-out ways to capture the killer, but the vast majority of them were considered inapplicable.

In terms of investigation, hundreds of letters claimed to have been written by the killer himself were much more interesting. Most likely, they are all a mystification (most believe that genuine letters from Jack the Ripper do not exist).
