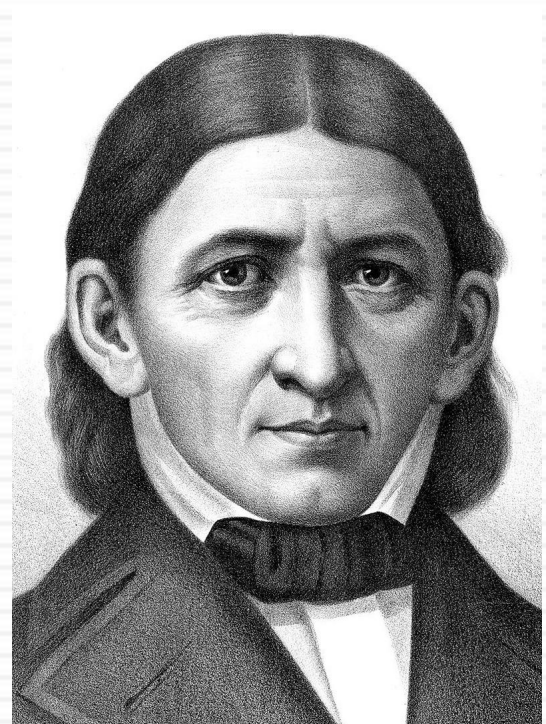
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Preschool education

The first kindergarten in America was opened in 1855. Children were brought up here according to the Froebel system. The main task was to instill love for nature and help with it. At the beginning of the 20th century, public kindergartens were already open in every big city.



Preschool education

Kindergartens in America are divided into two types of ownership - private and public:

- creche;
- kindergarten;
- center for preschool programs;
- day care center for children.



Preschool education

Early Childhood Education is a modern action educational centers. At the end of such training, graduates are issued certificates that reflect the results of the child.



Preschool education

The difference between a nursery and a kindergarten.

The nursery accepts children from 3 years old. Children are helped to learn about the world around them, learn to make friends, take care of themselves and others.

In kindergartens, children are specifically prepared for school. Teachers start working with them in a playful way.



Primary education

Primary schools usually teach children from age 5 to 11 or 12. One teacher teaches all subjects.



Primary education

Primary school teaches arithmetic, reading and writing. Fine arts, music and physical education lessons are held once or twice a week.



Primary education

Younger schoolchildren are divided according to their abilities and form three groups: gifted, average and incapable.

An appropriate training program is selected for each group.



Secondary education

(middle school)

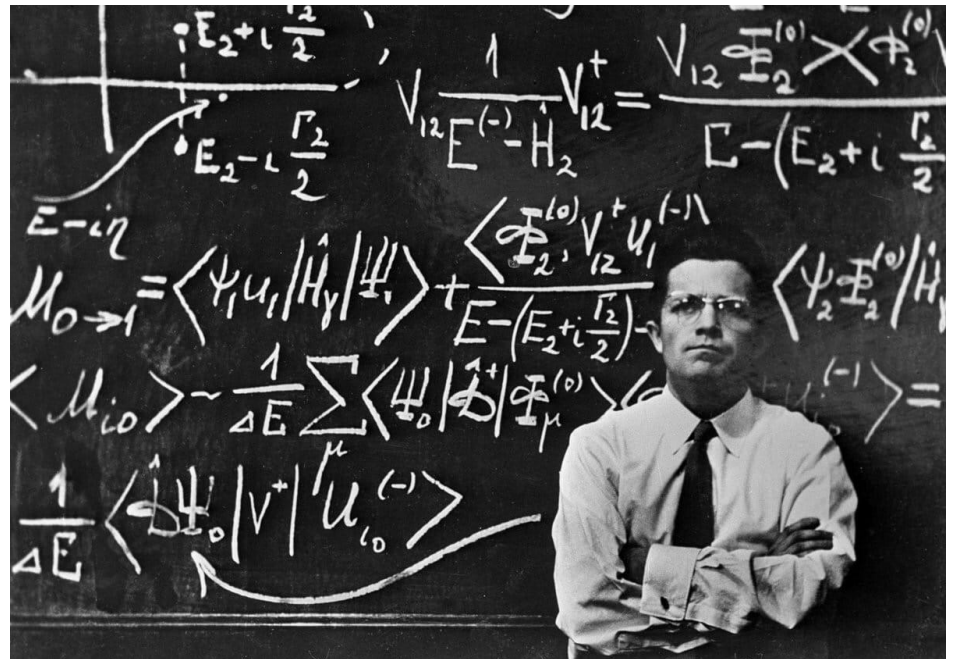
Secondary schools usually teach children aged 11 or 12 to 14 years — from the sixth or seventh to the eighth grade. Usually, in high school one teacher teaches one subject.



Middle school

Required subjects are mathematics, English, science, social science (often including world history) , and physical education.

Students choose one or two subjects themselves.



Middle school

In high school, the division of students into ordinary and advanced streams also begins.



Secondary education

(high school)

High school is the education students receive in the final stage of secondary education in the United States.
(from about 14 to 18 years old)

After high school students receive a diploma and are honored to take part in graduating ceremony.



Higher education

Higher education in the United States is considered one of the best in the world.

The degree structure at America's colleges and universities includes:

- Bachelor Degree;
- Master's Degree;
- Doctorate Degree.



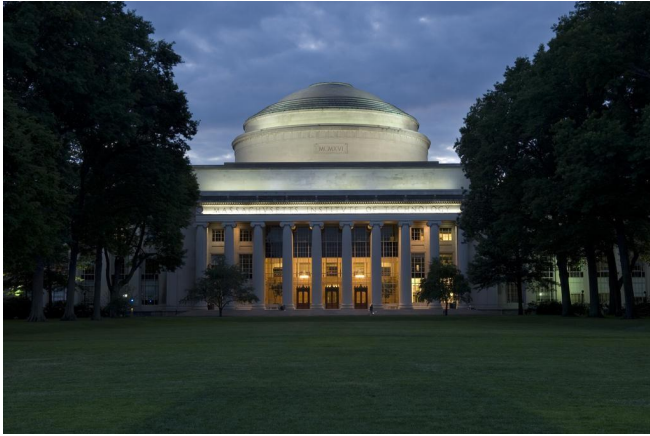
Higher education
