Yes/No Questions (General)

TO BE

- I <u>am</u> a businessman. Are you a businessman?
- He <u>was</u> a talented entrepreneur. -Was he a talented entrepreneur?
- Ted is coming. Is Ted coming?

NO 'BE'

 \bigcirc

- 1) I <u>know</u> a lot of people there. **Do** you know a lot of people there?
- 2) I have just finished my MBA. Have you just finished your MBA?

WH-Questions (Special)

-What **is** your occupation? How big **is** your company? -What kind of car **do** you drive?

Subject-Object Q:

- Who likes the boss?
- 2) Who does the boss like?

Prepositions in Questions:

Prepositions usually come in the end of the Q, but BEFORE time and place expressions:

Which company does she work **for**? Who do you report **to** *at the moment*?

DIRECT/INDIRECT QUESTIONS

OMr. Brown is leaving on Monday. – statement When is Mr. Brown leaving? – direct Q – word order Verb-Subject Do you know when Mr Brown is leaving? - indirect Q - word order Subject-Verb **Special Questions:** D: How much does it cost? Ind.: Do you know how much it costs? D.: Why did Mr Peters leave? Ind.: Could you tell me why Mr Peters left? <u>Yes/No Q. – we add if or whether:</u> D: Is it going to rain tomorrow? Ind Do you know if it is going to rain tomorrow?
