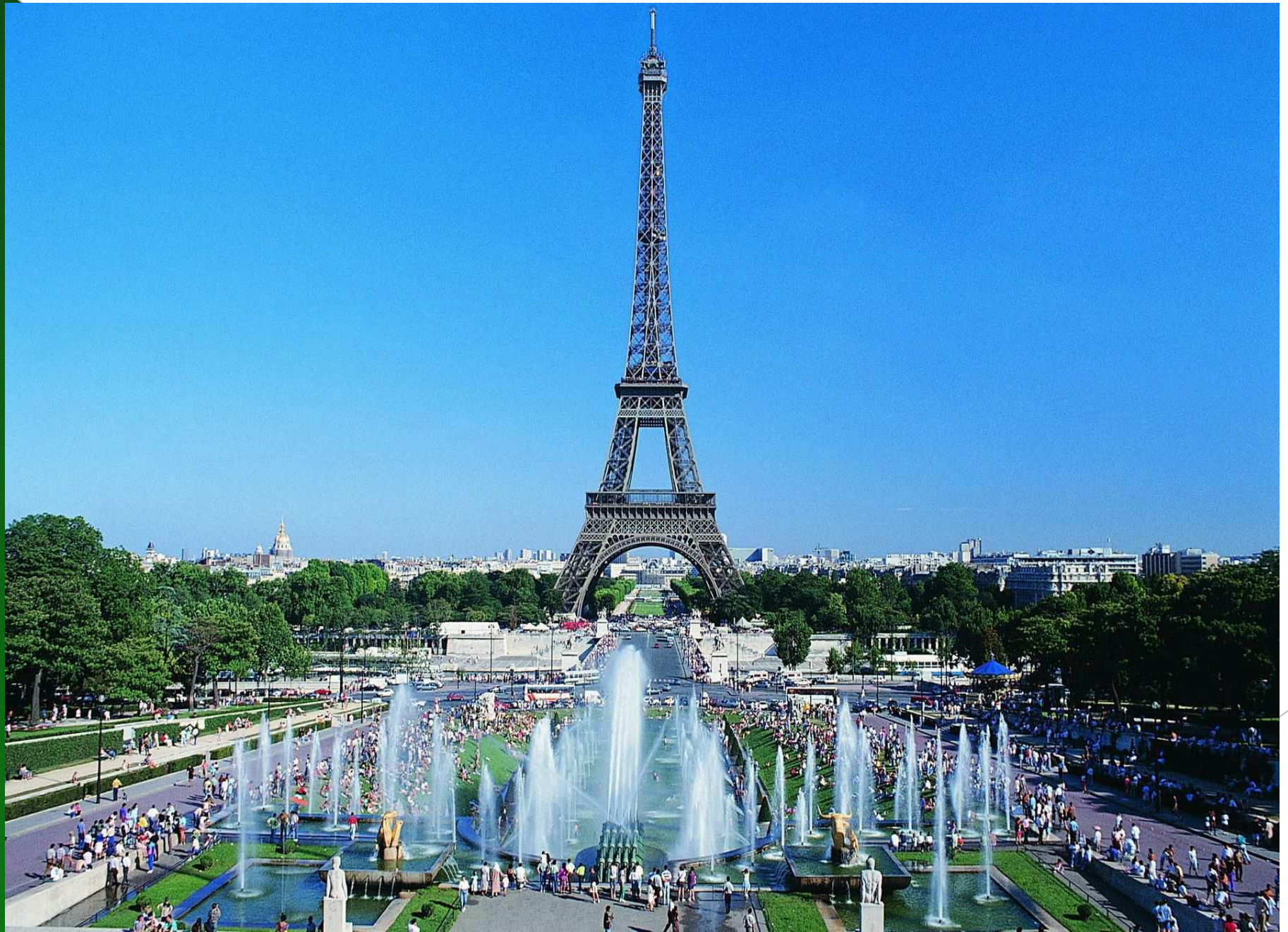
History of Paris

- Visited by millions of tourists every year. The iron structure is illuminated at night and is photographed by many people. It is an opportunity for both tourists and locals to see views of the city or district.



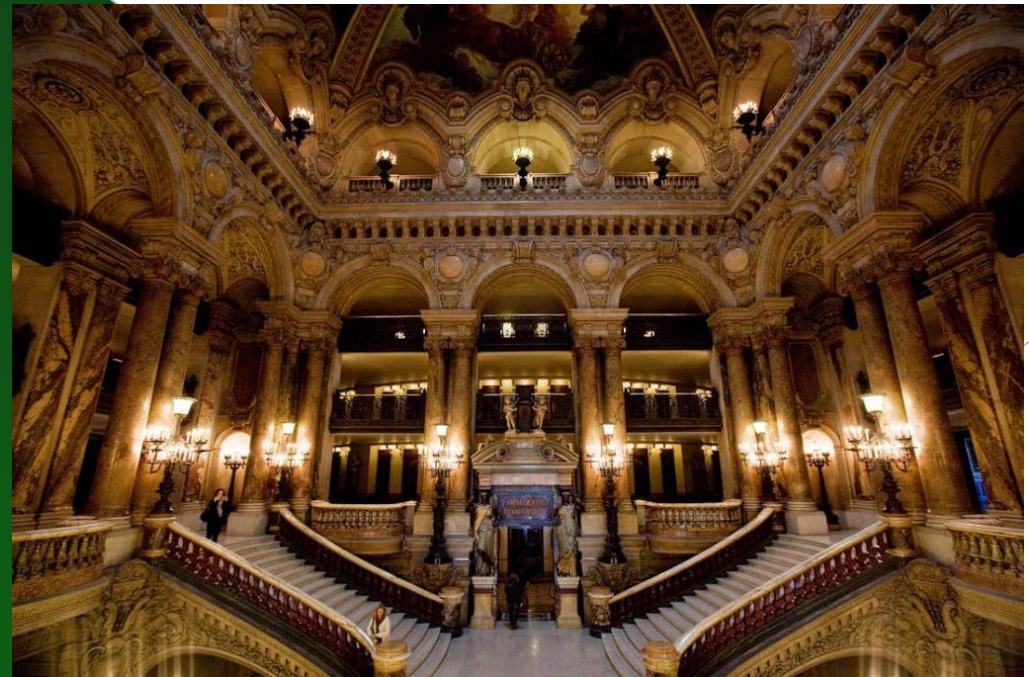
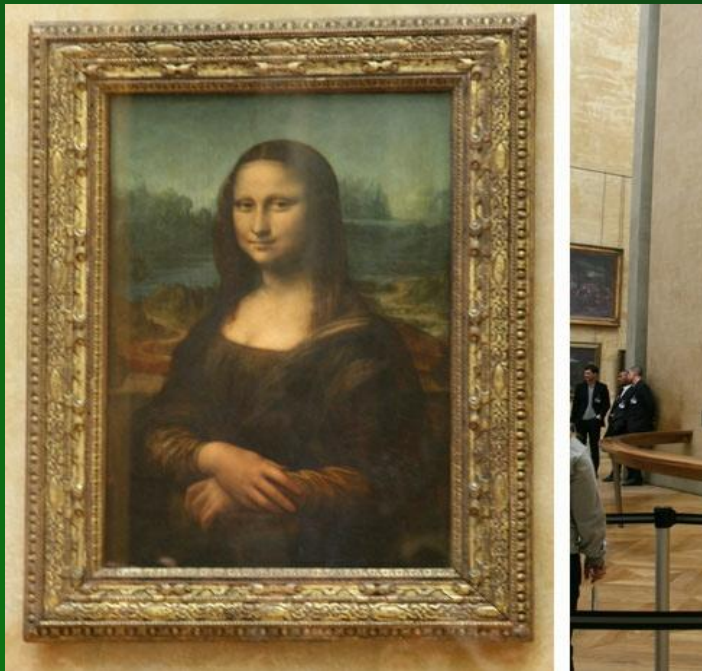


Musée du Louvre.

L'arc de triomphe

- One of the most famous monuments in Paris, the Arc de Triomphe memorializes the soldiers who died fighting for France during the Napoleonic wars. At 50 meters wide, the archway is large enough for a car to pass through. The archway is covered in relief sculptures of the battles of Austerlitz, Jena, and Eylau, and is topped by a frieze of the names of the 660 French generals who died fighting for the Republic during the world war.

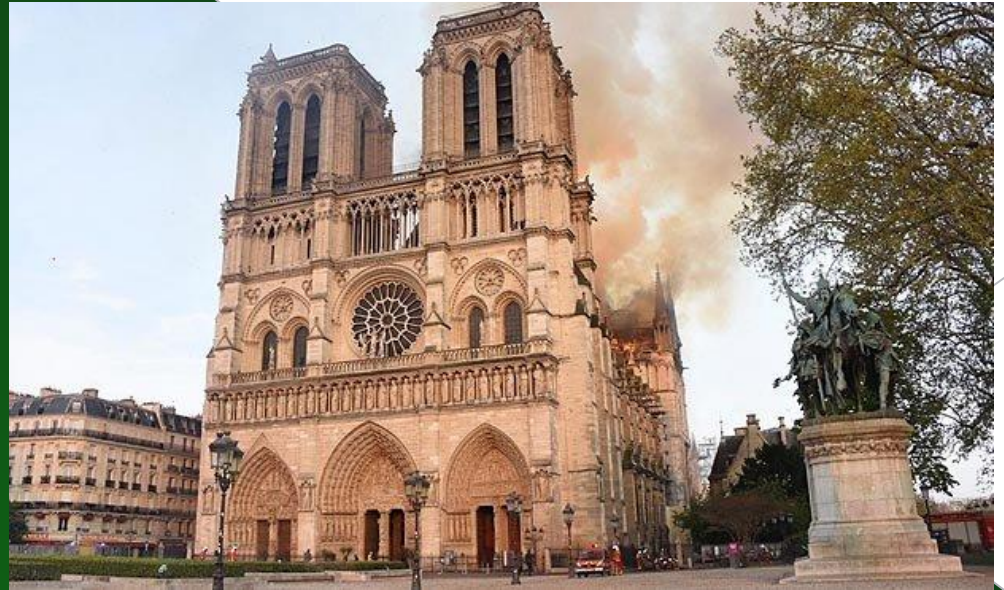
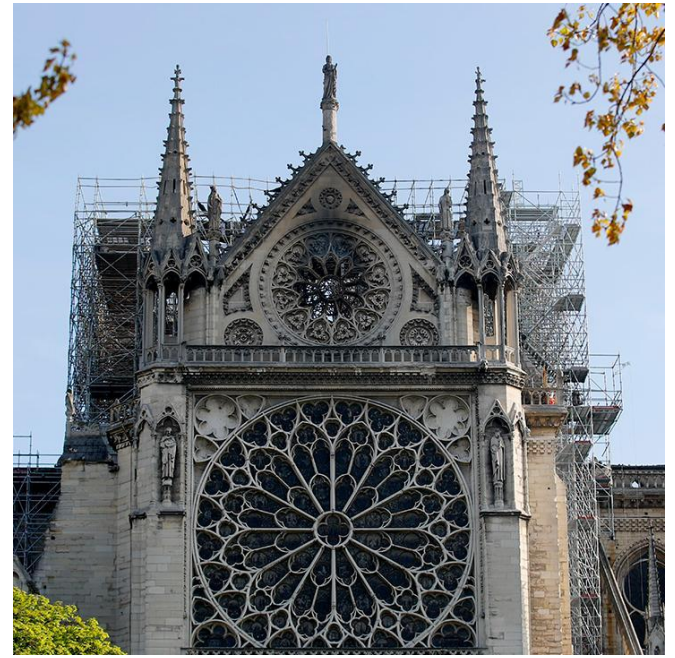




Notre Dame de Paris

- The Palace of Versailles is the former king's court and is the most visited landmark in France. It is famous for its 357 mirrors decorated with the French Revolution and the

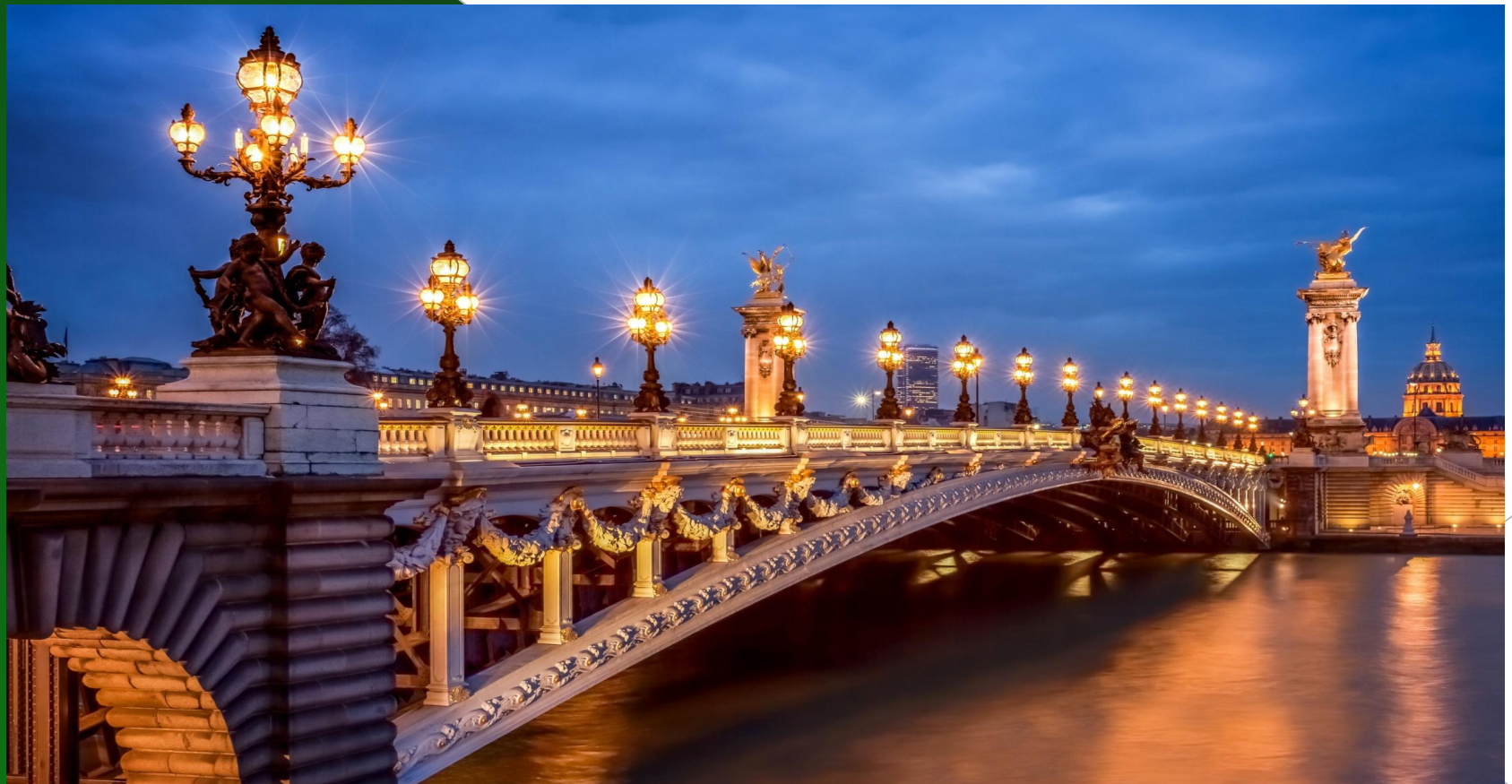






Le Pont Alexandre III
