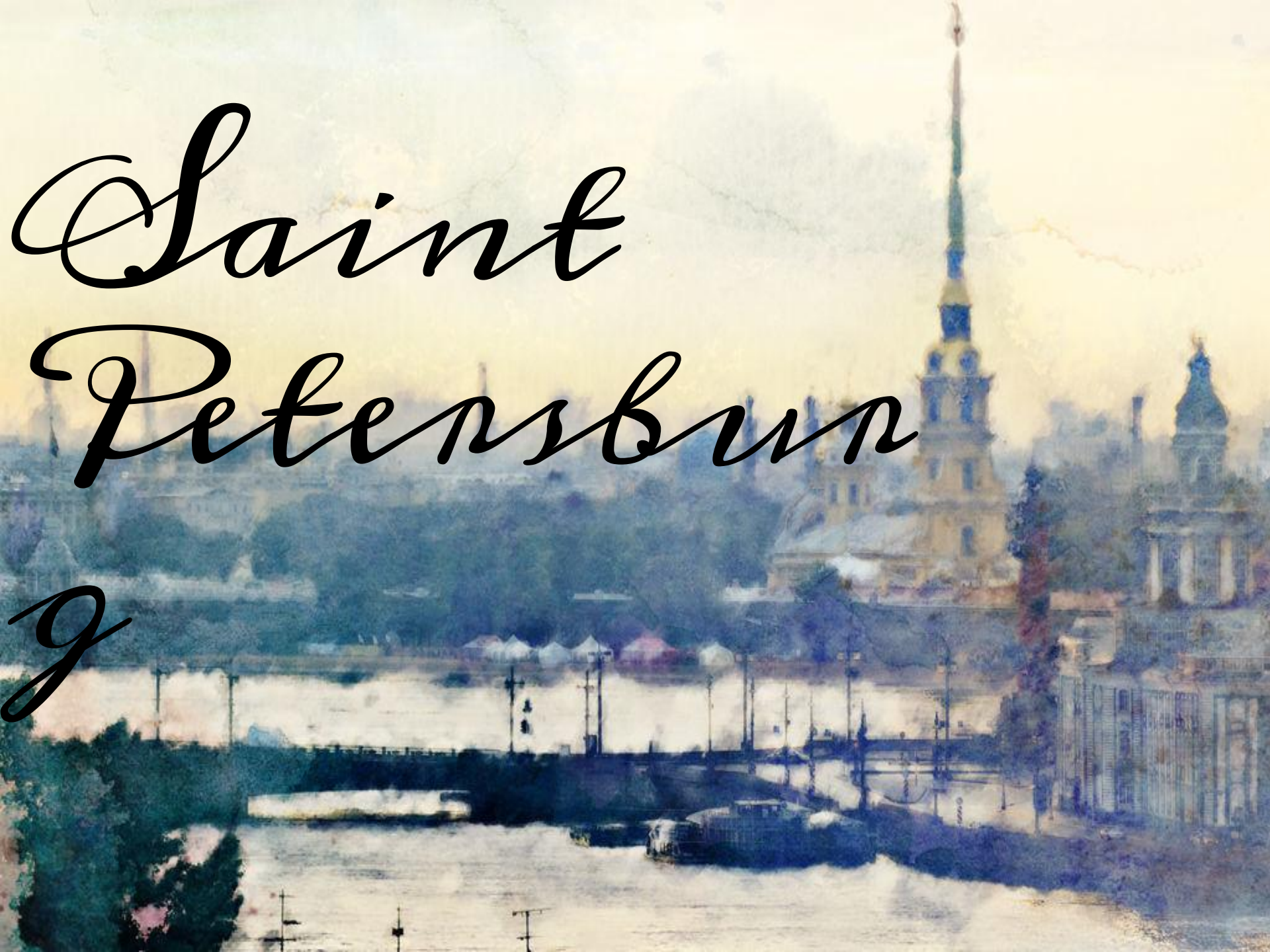


COLLEGES, SCHOOLS AND PARKS.**



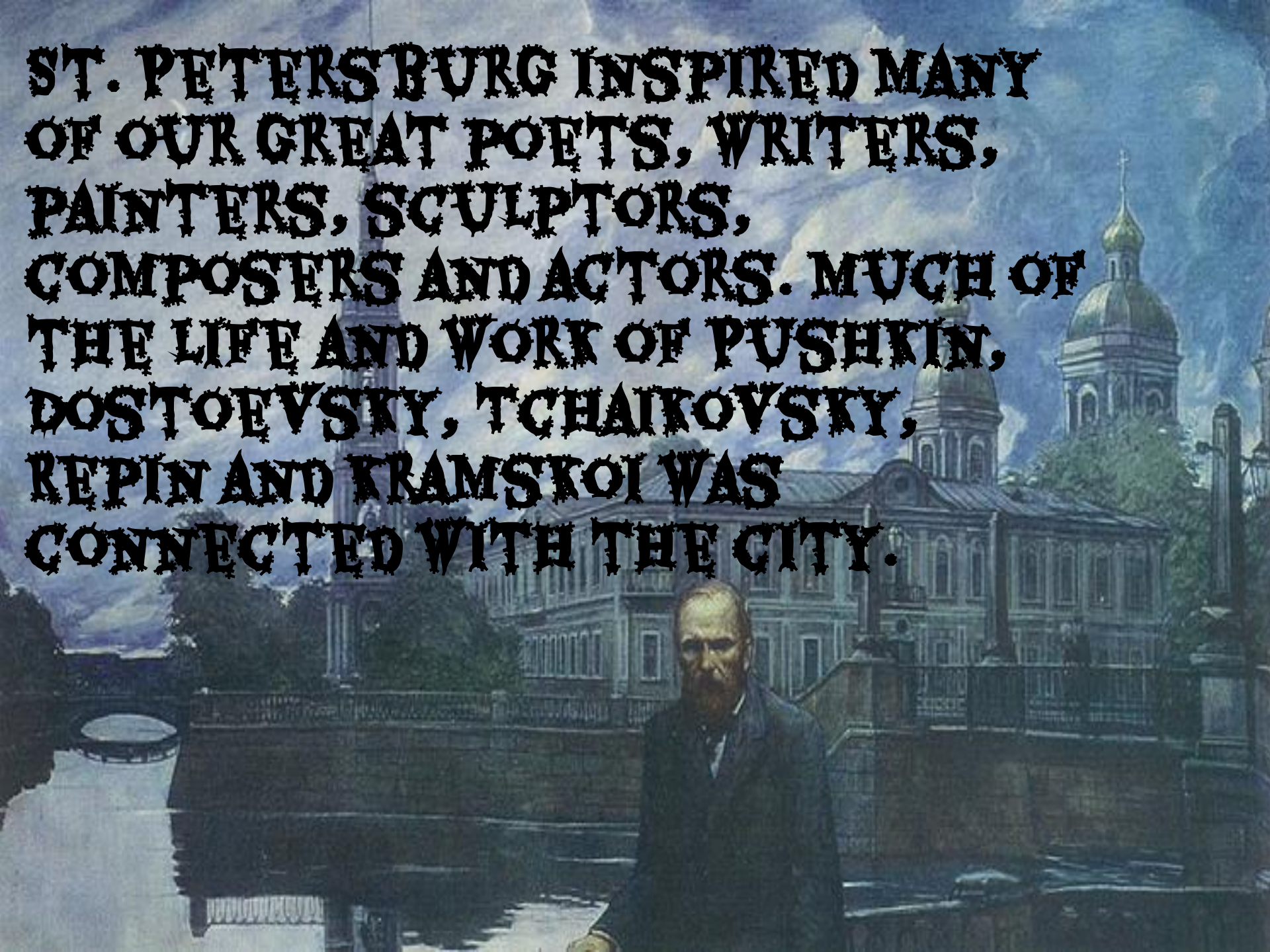


ST. PETERSBURG IS FAMOUS FOR ITS
