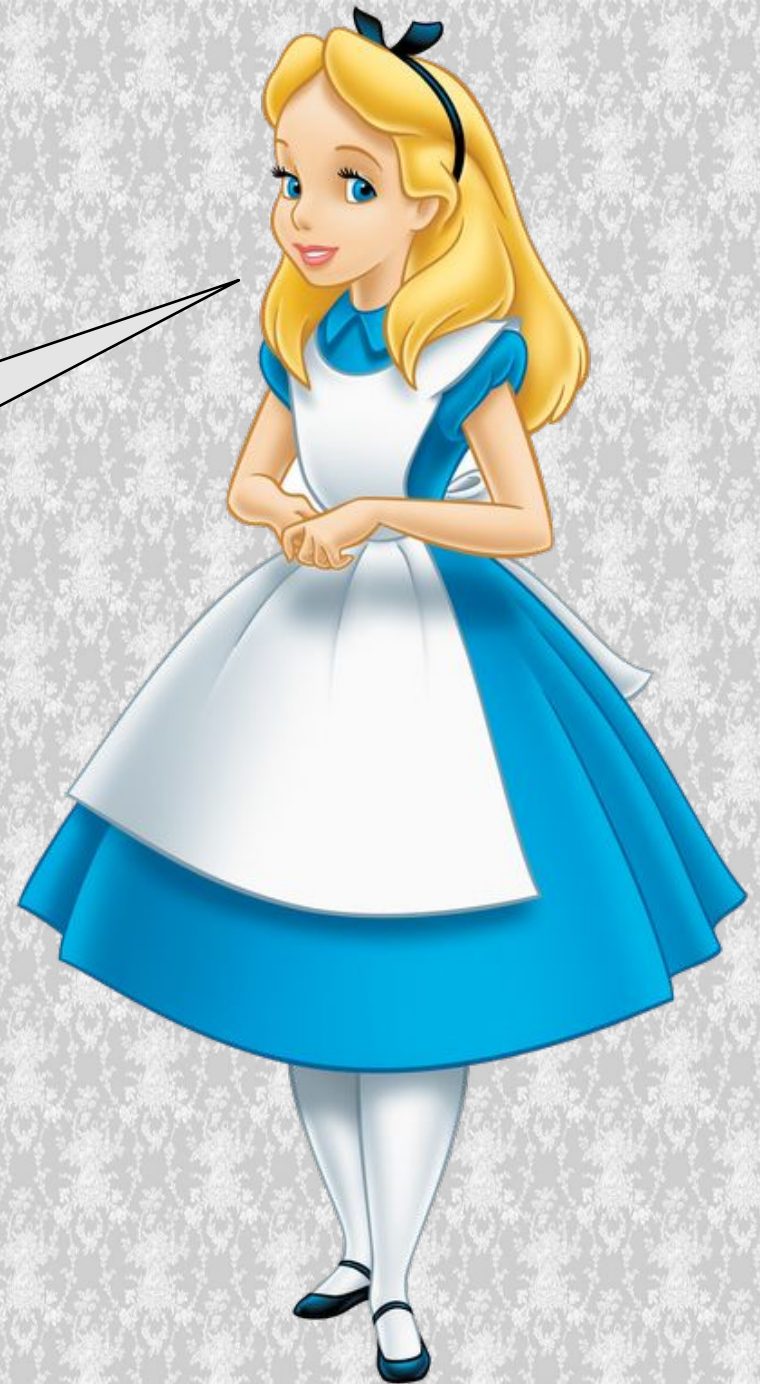

(Alexandrina Victoria)

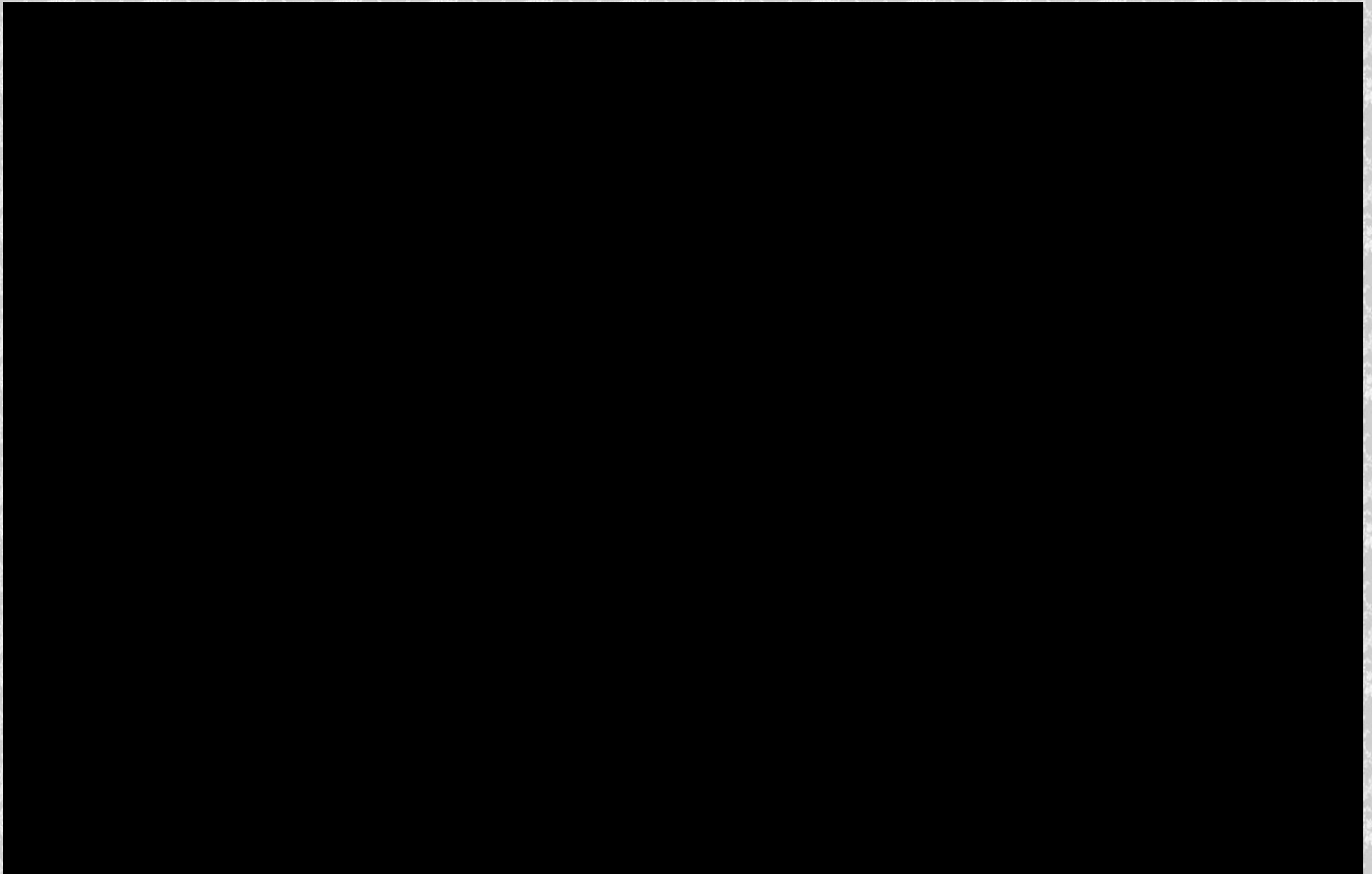
24 May 1819 – 22 January 1901



Victorian era is the period of Queen Victoria's reign 20.06.1837-22.01.1901

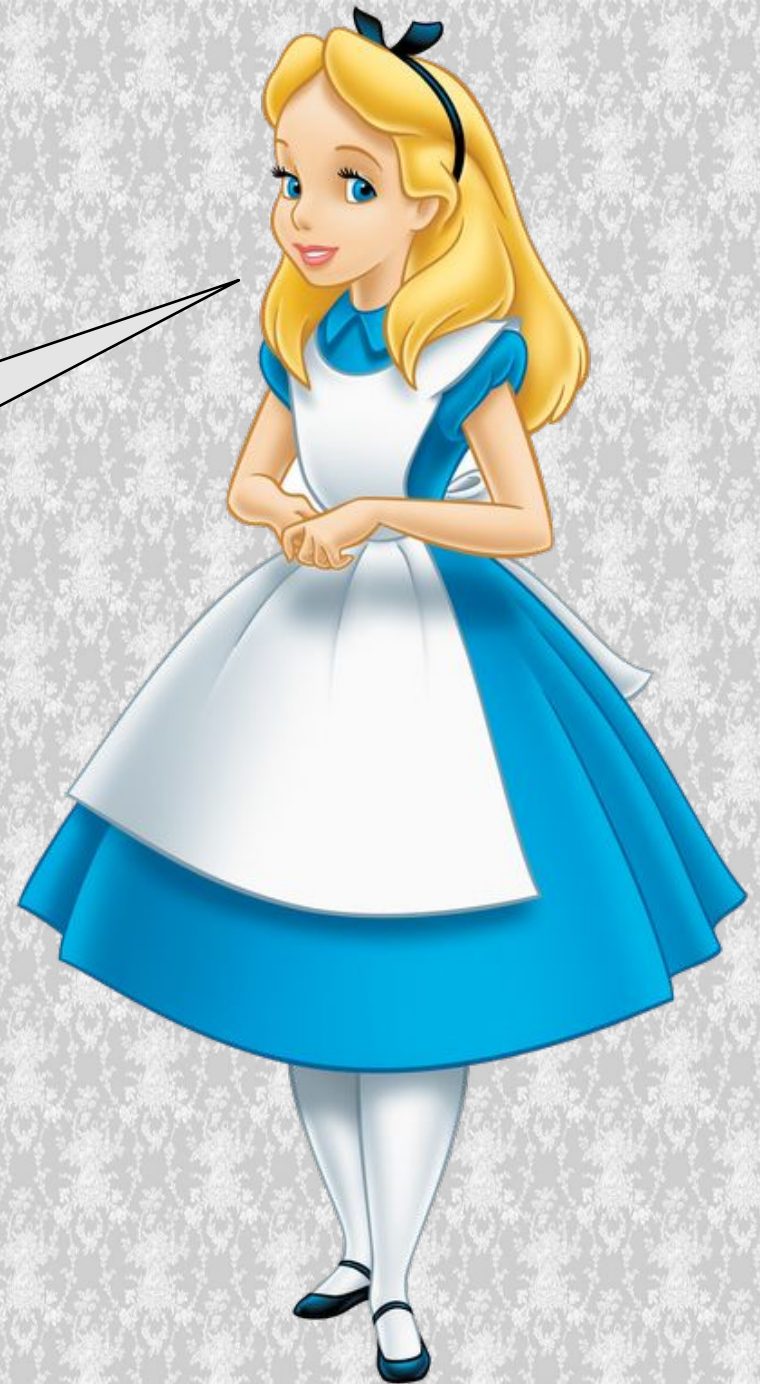

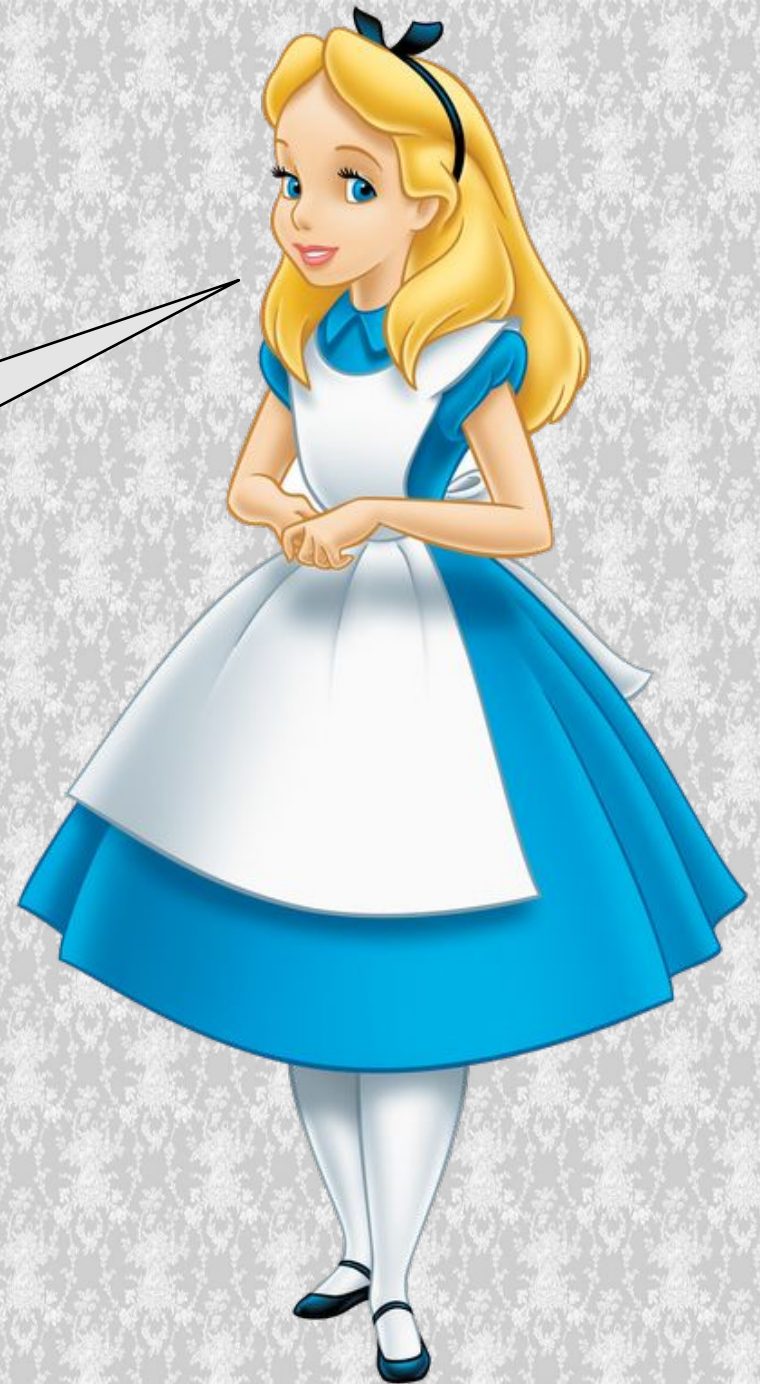

British Empire



Let's go together through Queen Victoria's timeline and find out what happened during the long and exciting life of the Queen.



Queen Victoria Timeline

Victoria becomes Queen after the death of her uncle, King William IV. She is only 18 years old, but immediately makes her mark as clever and confident.

← 1837

Victoria marries her German Cousin Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg. They have an extremely happy marriage, and he is the love of her life.

1840 →

Queen Victoria opens the Great Exhibition, an international exhibition organised by Prince Albert. It is remembered as the high point of the Victorian period.

← 1851

Prince Albert dies of typhoid fever. Queen Victoria was devastated, and for five years she made no public appearances. For the rest of her life, Victoria wore only black.

1861 →

Queen Victoria makes her first public appearance after the death of her husband to attend the Royal opening of Parliament, improving her popularity with her subjects.

← 1866

1876 →

Queen Victoria is made Empress of India following the Indian Mutiny and the Creation of the British Raj. She was a keen supporter of the British Empire.

Queen Victoria celebrates her Diamond Jubilee marking 60 years as Queen. Soldiers from all over the Empire parade through London.

← 1897

1901 →

Queen Victoria dies aged 81, the longest-reigning monarch in British history. The whole nation mourned, and lined the streets to watch the funeral procession.

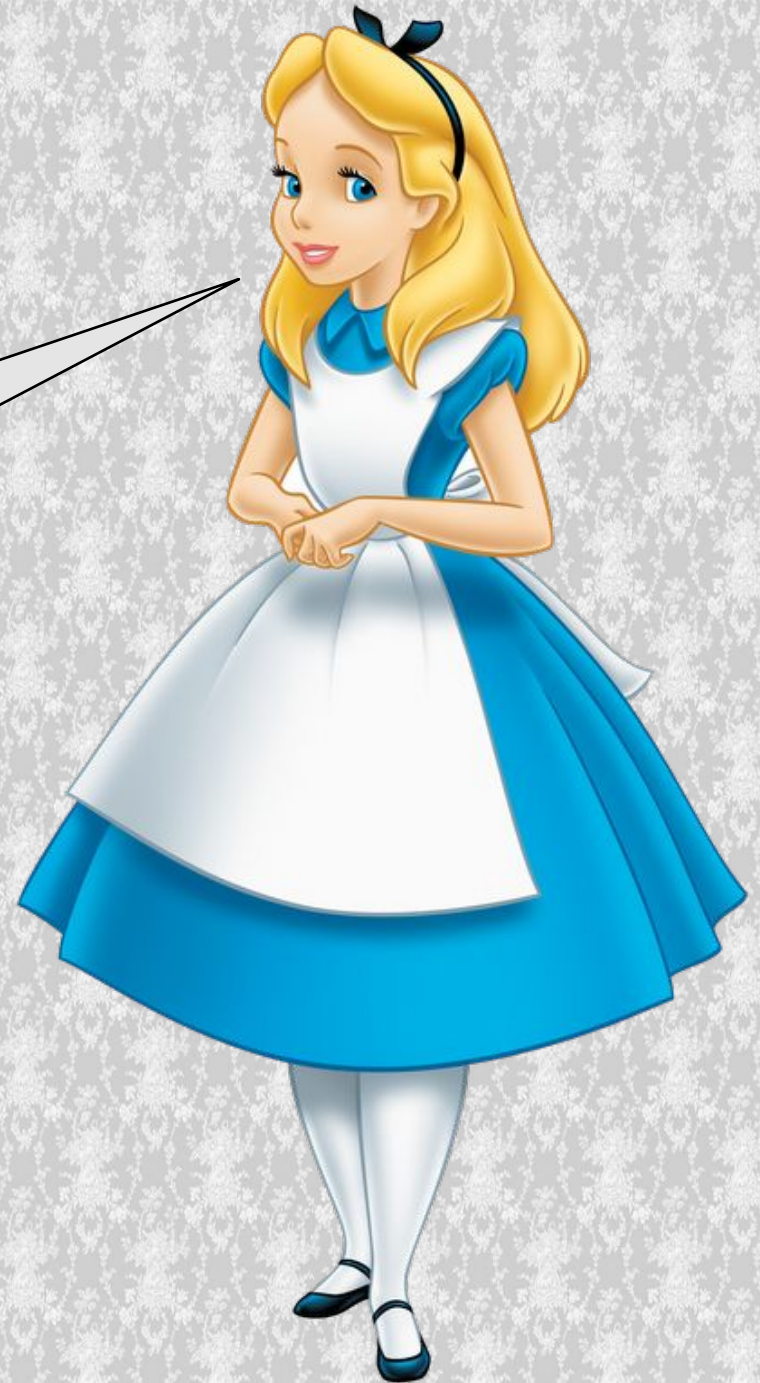

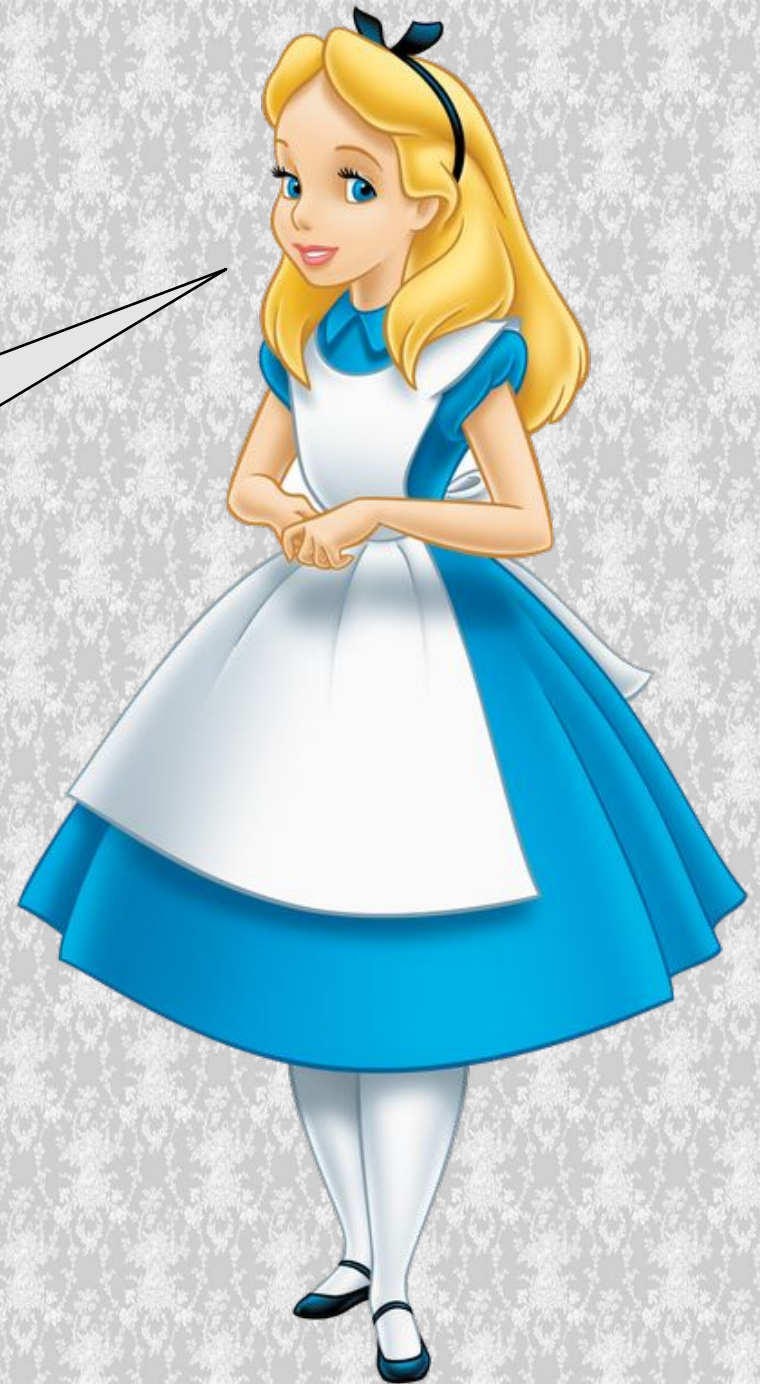

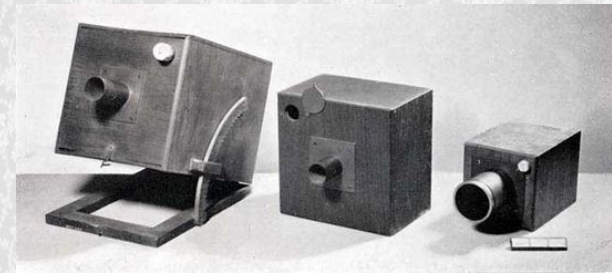
A lot of things were invented during the Victorian era in different countries. Many of them we use today. Let's study the list of the inventions.

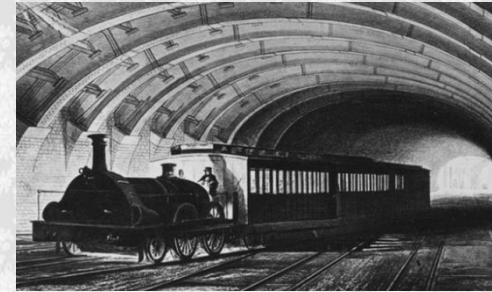
→ The first public flushing toilet opened in London.

Invention of the penny-farthing bicycle.

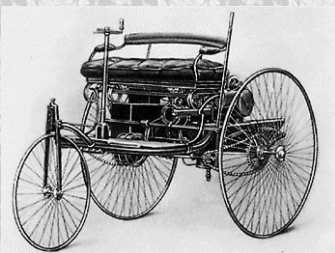
The electric light bulb was invented by Swan and Edison for home use.

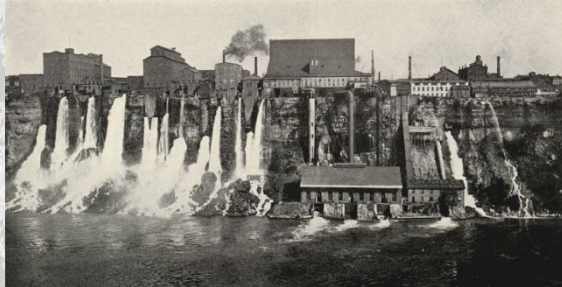
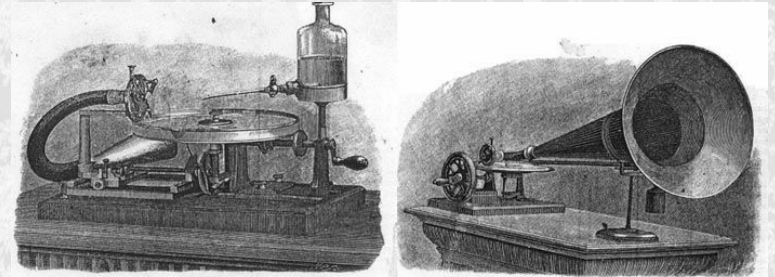
First petrol motorcar was built by Karl Benz. A three-wheeled vehicle powered by a one-cylinder gasoline engine.



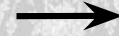
Inventions of Victorian Era

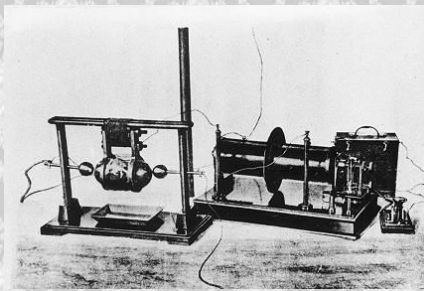

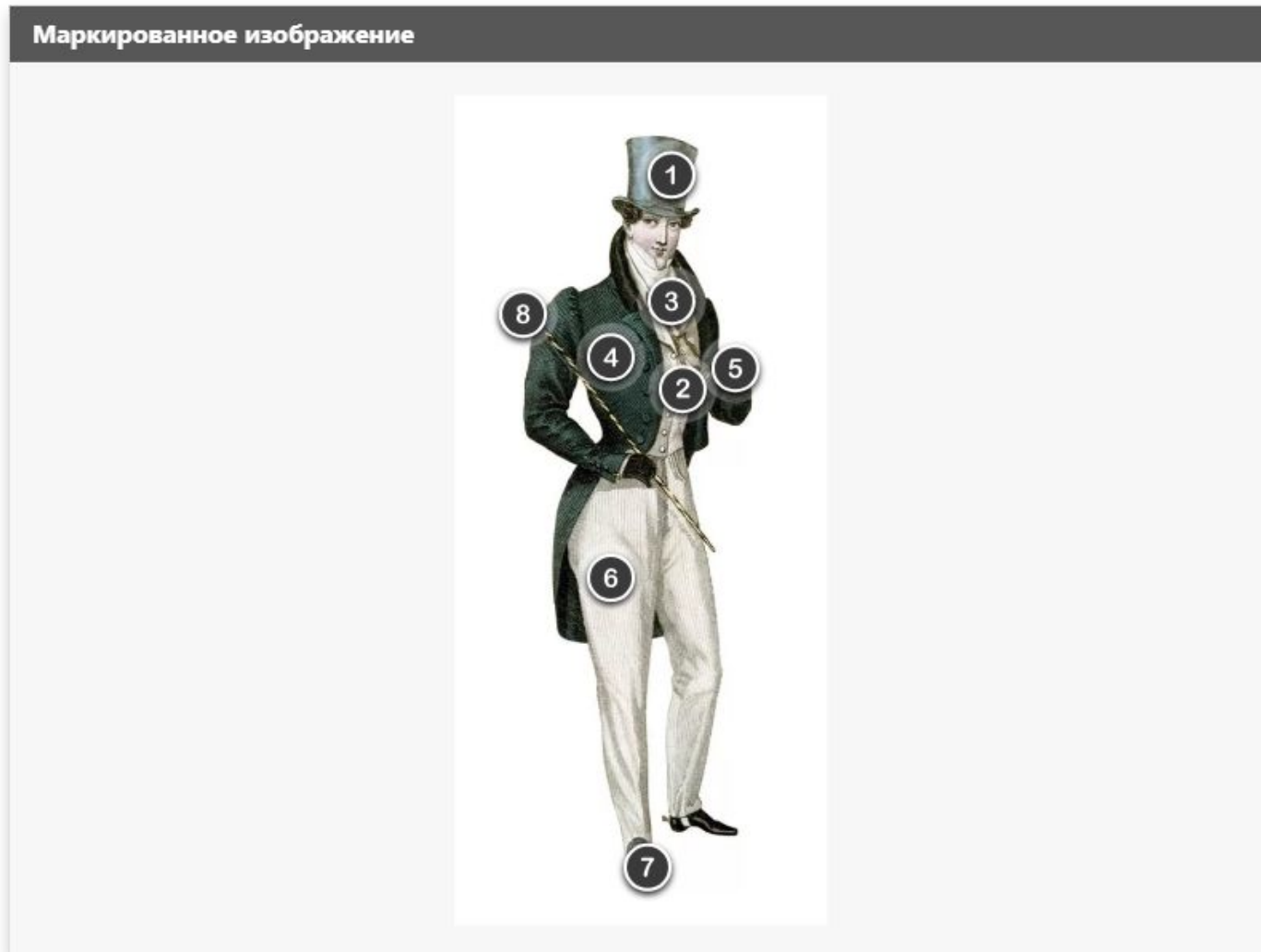

4. Boil mushrooms and puree them.
5. Heat the soup and filter it. Serve hot.
6. Add mushrooms, cream, and season the soup.

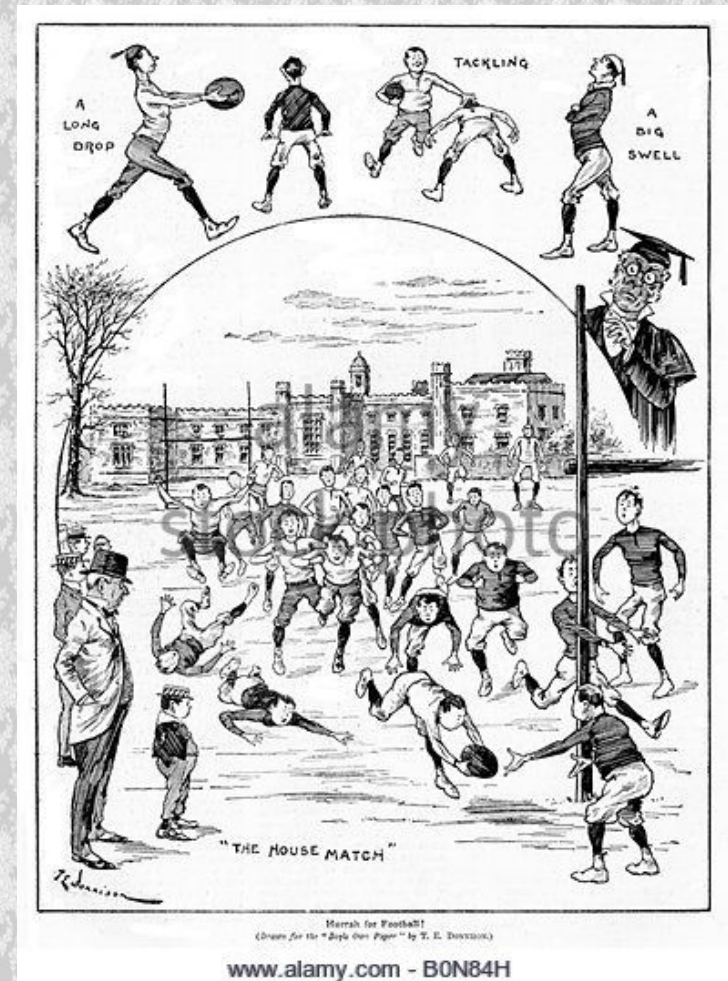

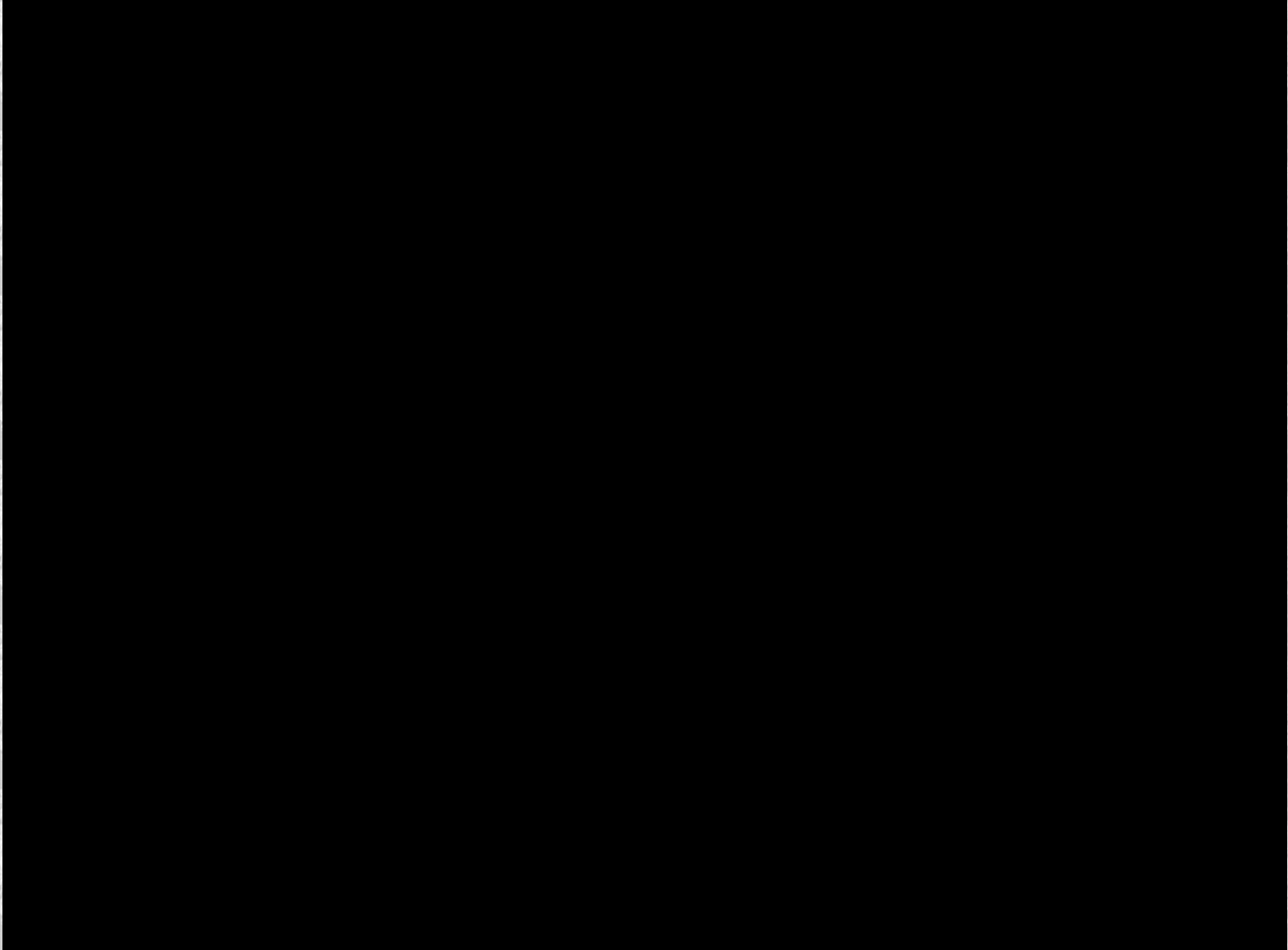
Going to School in Victorian Times

Although there had been schools dated back as far as the 6th Century many Victorian boys and girls did not have the opportunity of going to school. When Queen Victoria came to the throne in 1837 education was still mainly for the privileged. Rich children might have a governess to teach them at home until they were old enough — if they were boys — to go to Public Schools such as Rugby (mentioned in the book, Tom Brown's Schooldays). The girls continued to be educated at home. Most poor children did not go to day school, but earlier, Robert Raikes had started a system of education based in churches, the Sunday School, and by 1831 1,250,000 children went to lessons in this way. That was about a quarter of the population at the time.

Later in Queen Victoria's reign a number of day schools had begun, including the British Schools, and the Ragged Schools (so called because of the tattered clothes worn by poor pupils). In 1870 a law was passed saying that children aged between 5 and 10 had to attend weekday school. The leaving age was raised to 11 in 1893. Even so, many children were kept away from school by parents and employers who would rather have them earning money.

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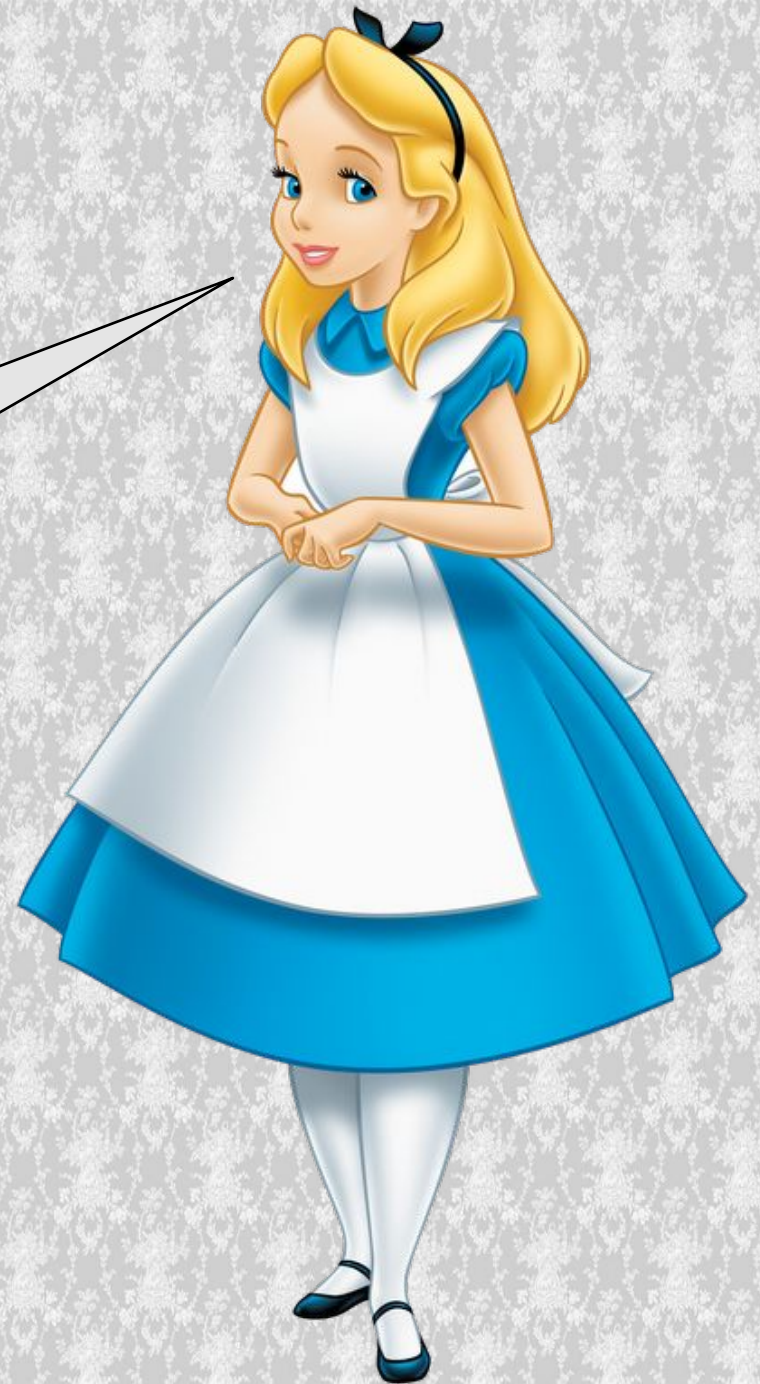



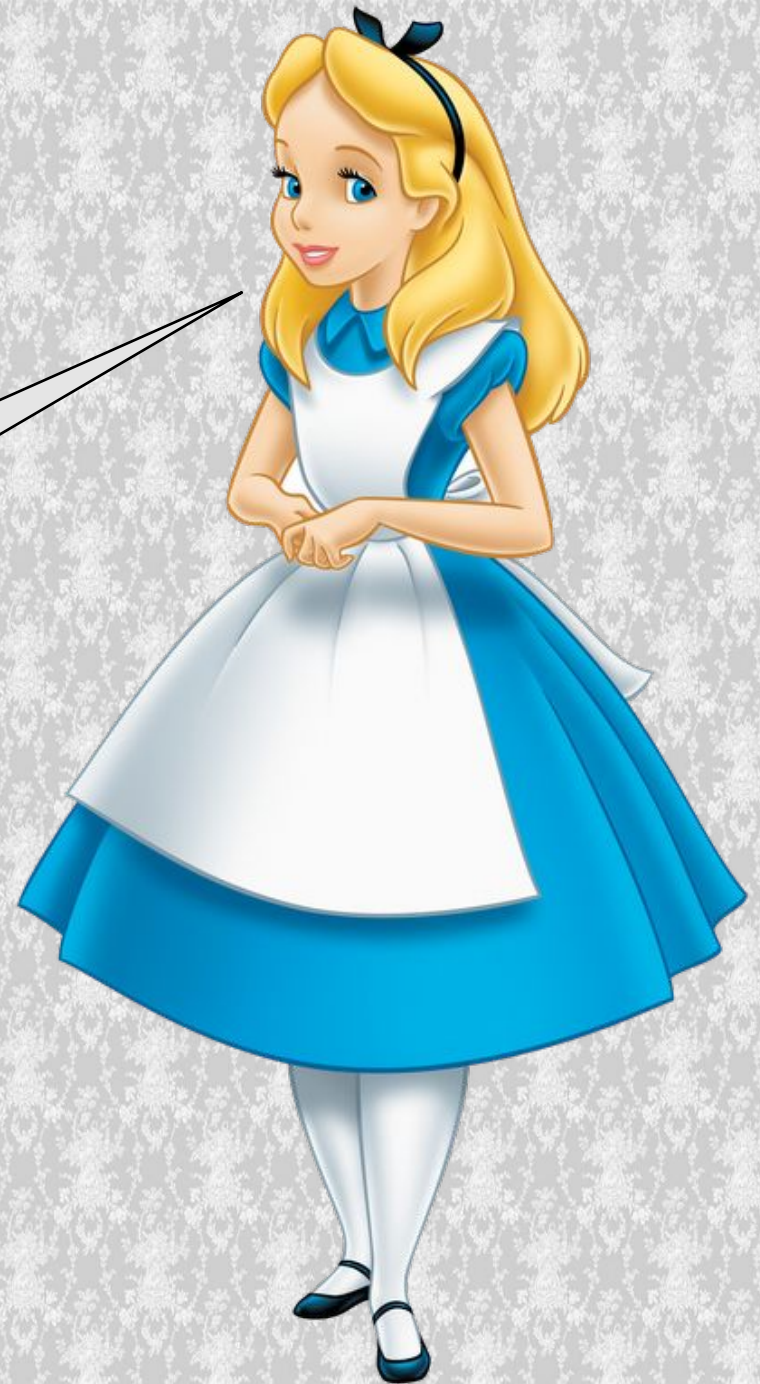
