- \*THE AIM of the work: to establish similarities and differences between English and Kalmyk superstitions, signs of wedding ceremonies; to create the booklet.
- \*The hypothesis of the study: I assume that the superstition of particular people depends on its socio-cultural characteristics (standard of living, historical roots).



- \*To achieve this aim, the following tasks were put forward:
- \*1) to highlight the most common signs and superstitions of wedding traditions in Kalmykia and England;
- \*2) to investigate the attitude of different age groups of people to omens and superstitions.
- \*3) find out the historical origin of wedding traditions of England;
- \*4) to study the literature on the subject of research;

### \*Methods of research:

- \*Theoretical (literature analysis, work with Internet resources, data synthesis).
- \*Practical (sociological survey, questionnaire).

\* «According to Bakshi Iki-Bagutova of khurul Erketenevsk ulus marriage is impossible to the 10-th generation, and according to claim the clergy of the IKI khurul in Malye Derbety (Bakshi, surkhazhi) — up to 49-th of the knee.»



- \*Some kinds of court wedding traditions was introduced by Queen Victoria:
- \*1. Colour of a bride's wedding dress white;
- \*2. The model of a Wedding dress -Victorian Bridal;
- \*3. Lace veil of the bride;
- \*4. Victorian wedding rings;
- \*5. Bridesmaid dresses in pastel shades;
- \*6. Wedding cake;
- \*7. Pieces of cake for guests-in napkins or boxes, bonbonniere.



The entire process consists of the wedding omens and traditions. They are countless.





There are the same greeting newlyweds, the table speeches, the wedding rings the wedding bouquet.





Since ancient times in England and Kalmykia there is a sign that during the wedding it is to throw a rice grains at the bride and groom.

One of the most important differences is the interpretation of signs- decorative horseshoes.






\* So in England only the blue tape is used for decorating weddings. It has long been believed that this colour brings good luck to the newlyweds.


