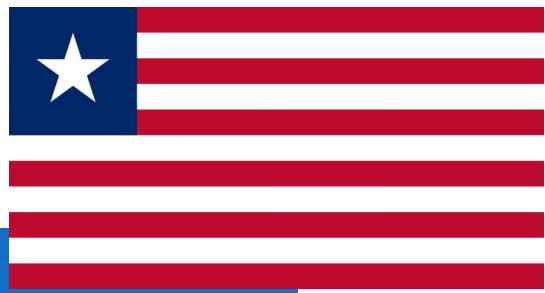


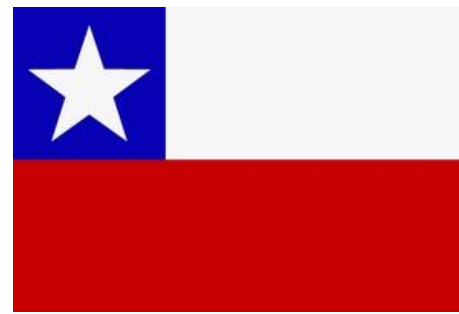

February 2

- The United States introduced a new nuclear doctrine since the Cold War, which marked the main countries that pose a nuclear threat. The list includes Russia, China, Iran and North Korea.

March 4

- Incident with poisoning of the former British intelligence officer Sergey Skrypal and his daughter Julia Skripal in the city of Salisbury, which led to a geopolitical rupture of diplomatic relations between Russia and Great Britain

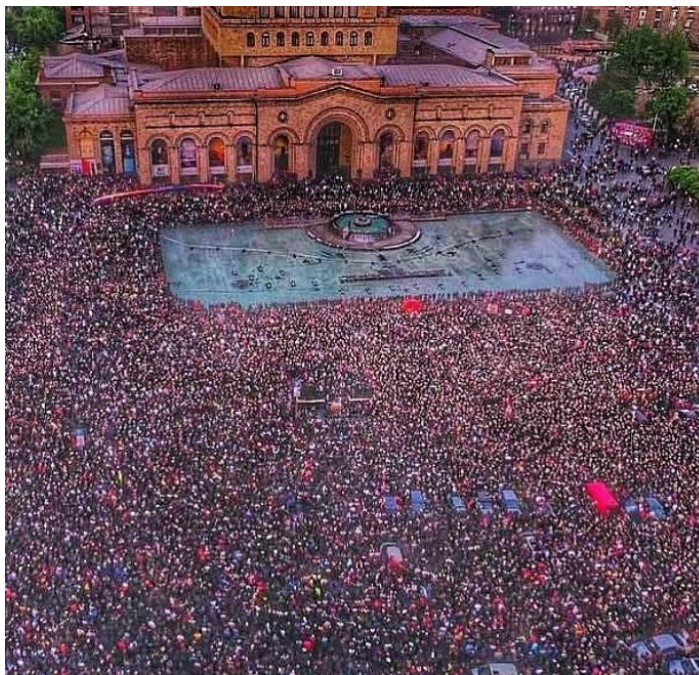
March 25

- a fire in the shopping center "Winter Cherry" in Kemerovo. March 28 in Russia was declared the day of mourning.



April 13 -

Armenia.



April 14

- a series of missile strikes by a coalition of the United States, Britain and France on a number of military and civilian facilities in Syria, committed as a response to a possible chemical attack made in the city of Duma in Eastern Ghouta (Russia regards these events as an aggressive attack)



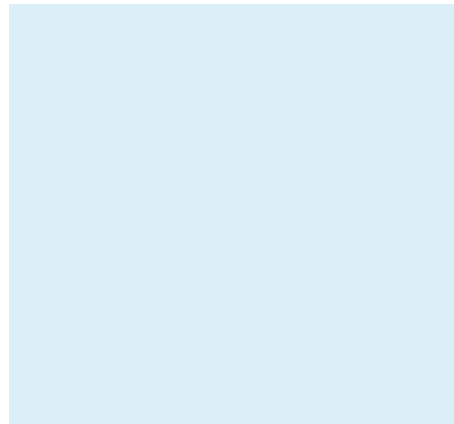
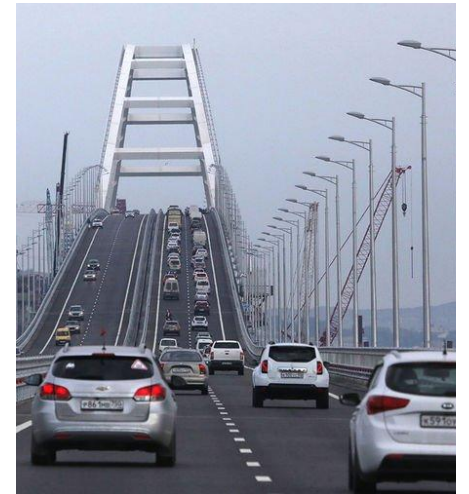


May 8–12

Russia led the UN Security Council

September 7

The Patriarchate of Constantinople first intervened in the church situation in Ukraine: in violation of the resolutions adopted at the First Constantinople (Second Ecumenical) Council in 381, Patriarch Bartholomew sent two exarchs from North America to Ukraine, launching the creation process in Ukraine churches on the basis of the non-auto-kalpalononical Kyiv Patriarchate, which was not recognized by the local Orthodox churches, respectively, by splitting the Orthodox Church





October 3

- Russian President Vladimir Putin signed the Federal Law on Amendments to Pension Laws, among which the increase in the retirement age

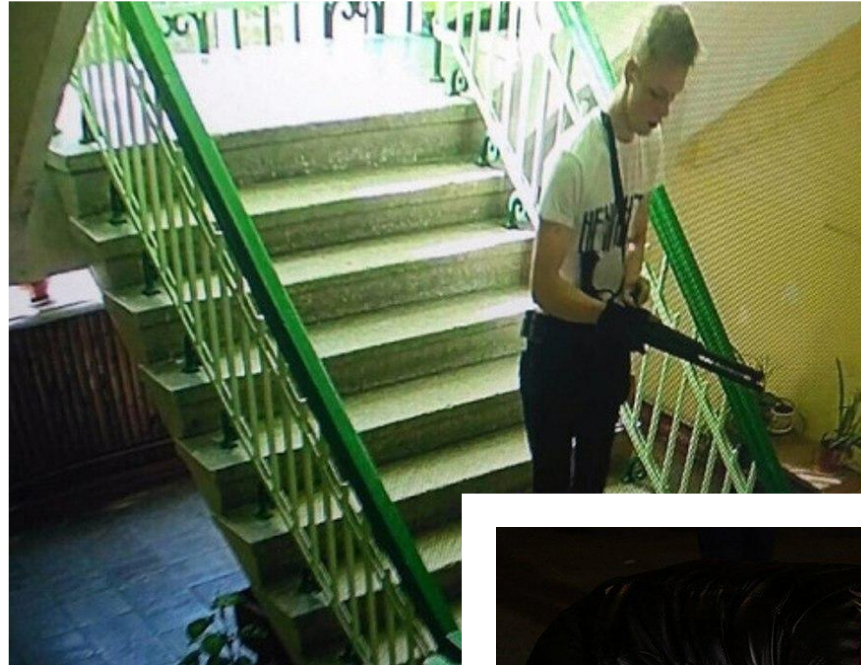


October 6

October 17

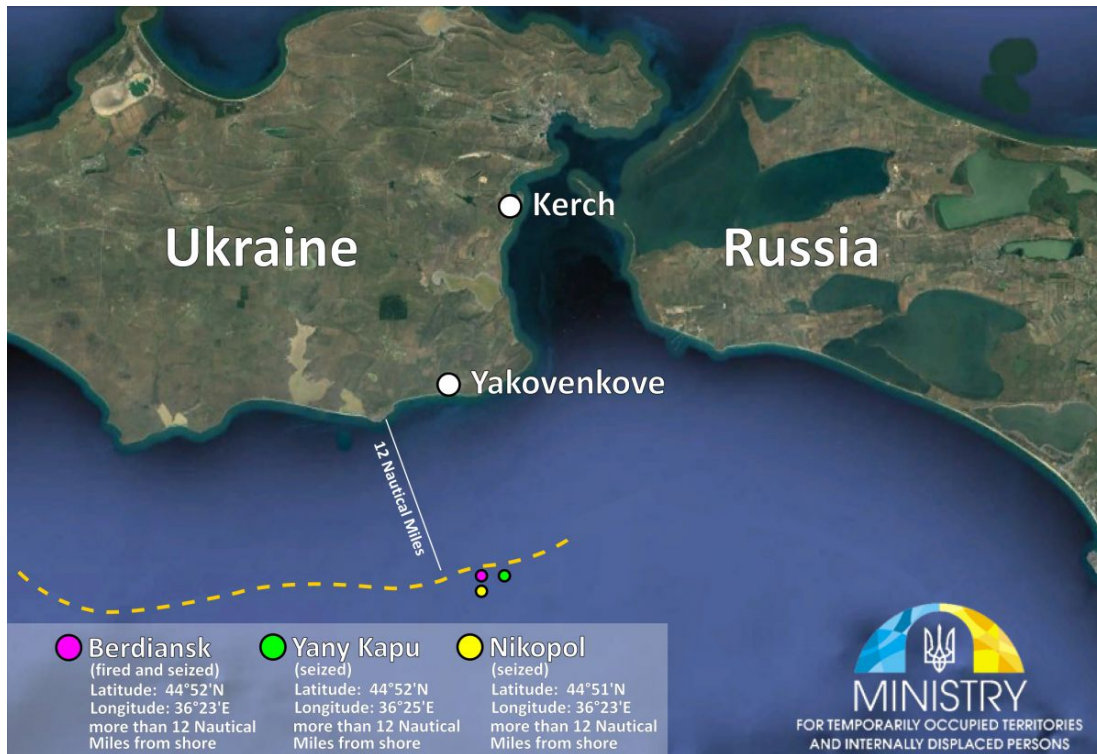
the massacre at the Kerch Polytechnic College; 21 people (including the murderer) killed, more than 50 wounded.
