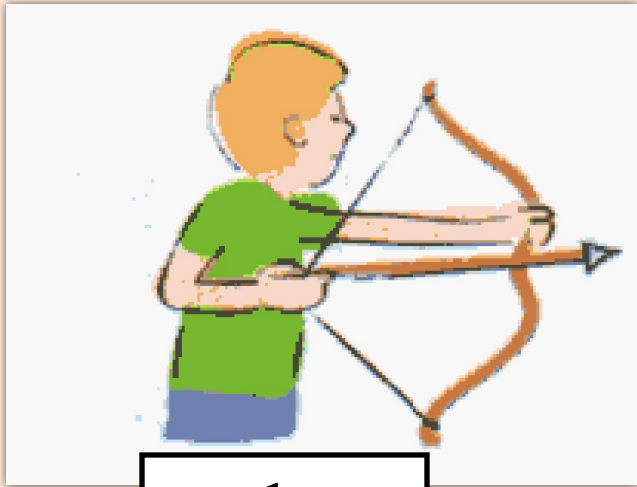

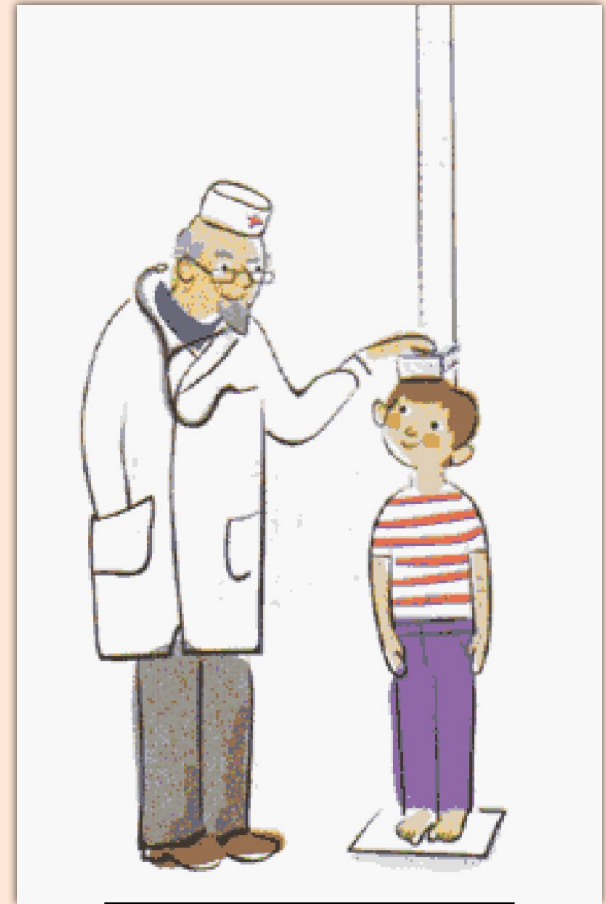
Будущее продолженное время



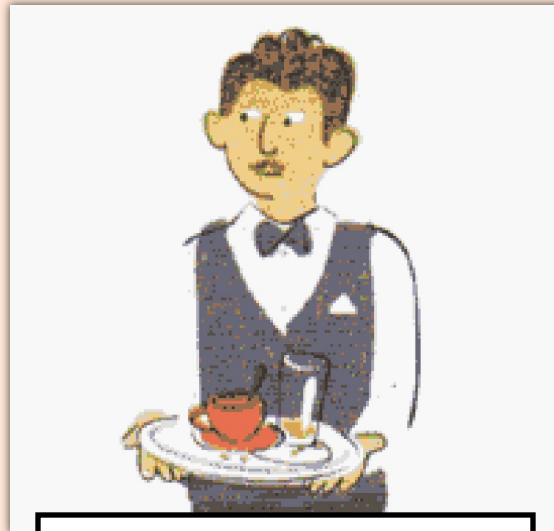
Say what these people are doing now.



to shoot



to measure



to take away



«Read the conversation»



Mary: May I come and see you at 8.30 in the evening?

Tom: I am afraid, not. I **will be watching** the match on TV.

shall/will be + Ving



I/we **shall/will be watching** TV at 5 o'clock tomorrow.

He, she, it, you, they **will be watching** TV at 5 o'clock tomorrow.



I/We **shan't/won't be watching** TV at
5 o'clock tomorrow.

He, she, it, you, they **won't be**
watching TV at 5 o'clock tomorrow.



Shall/will *I/we* be watching TV at 5 o'clock tomorrow?

Will *he, she, it, you, they* be watching TV at 5 o'clock tomorrow.



Adverbs of time

at 5 o'clock tomorrow

at this time tomorrow

from 3 till 5 o'clock on Sunday

next Sunday (summer...)

In two days (weeks, months...)



The Future Continuous tense describes

an action happening at a certain moment in the future



I will be lying on the beach *at this time tomorrow*.

= **I am going to lie** on the beach *at this time tomorrow*.

The Future Continuous tense describes

personal plans in the future



I will be leaving for London *at 6 p.m. tomorrow.*
I am leaving for London *at 6 p.m. tomorrow.*
