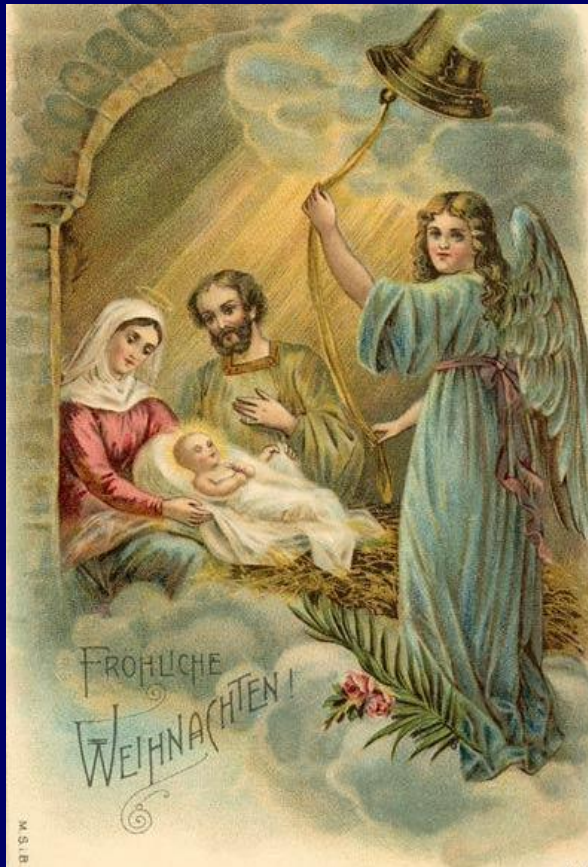

A symbolic form of a wreath, a circle with red ribbons, means the royal colour and the future resurrection of Christ.




Christmas Mass in Great Britain

- This day it was possible to eat only sochivo-boiled wheat with honey, varenniki or borsch.

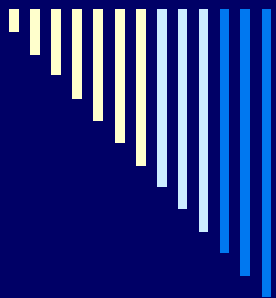
The 7th of January!
