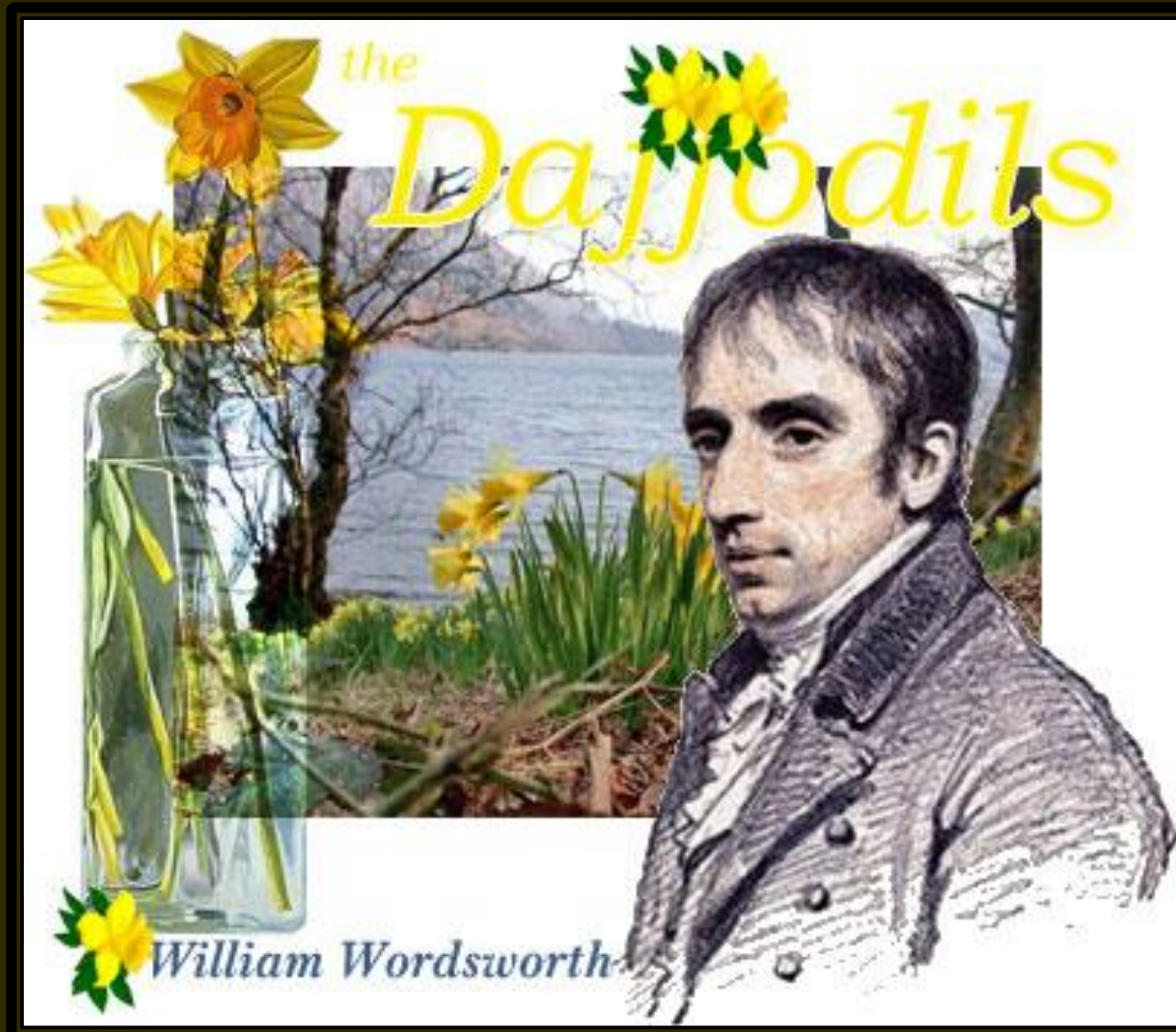

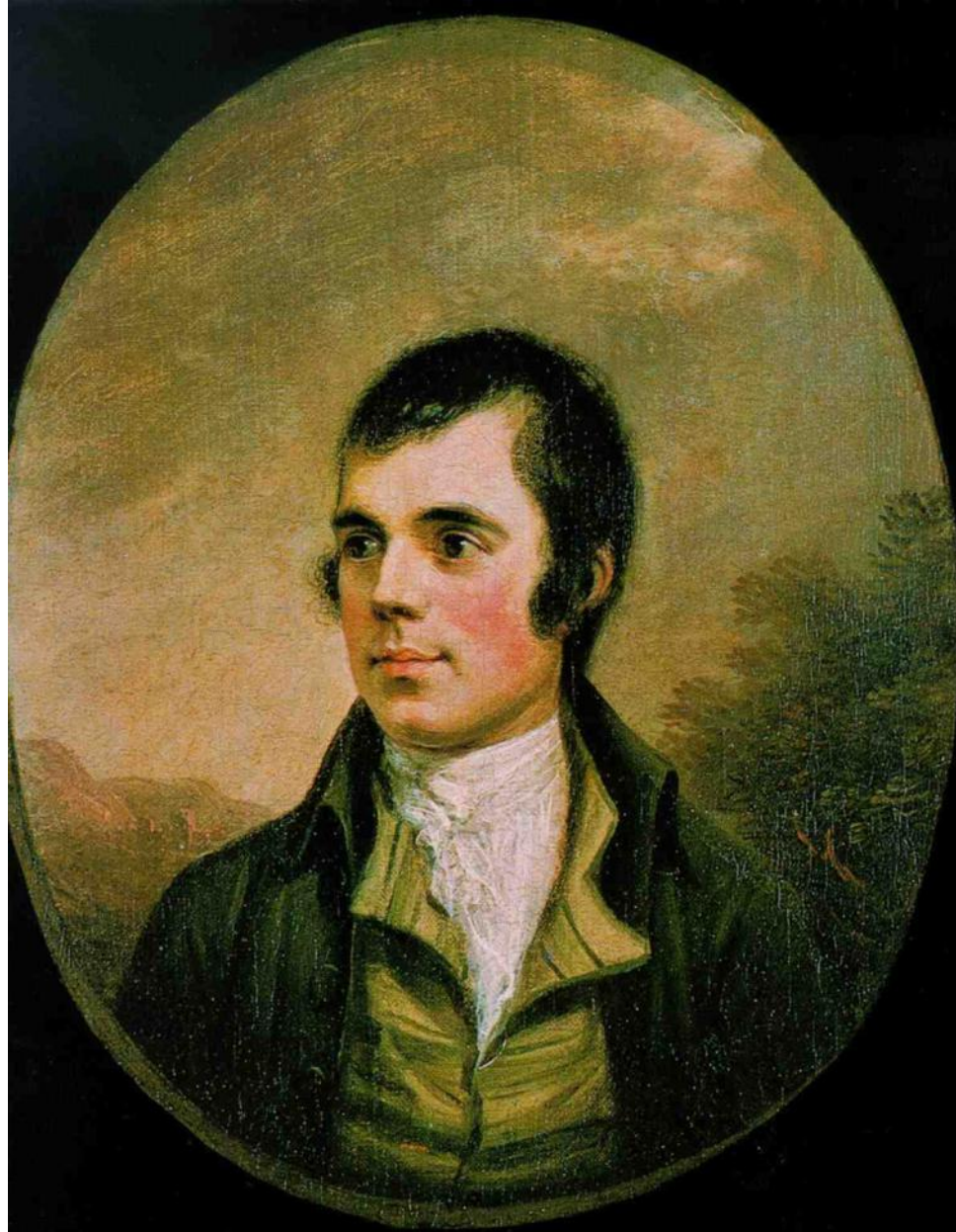


"Snowflakes"





Snowflake Brushset

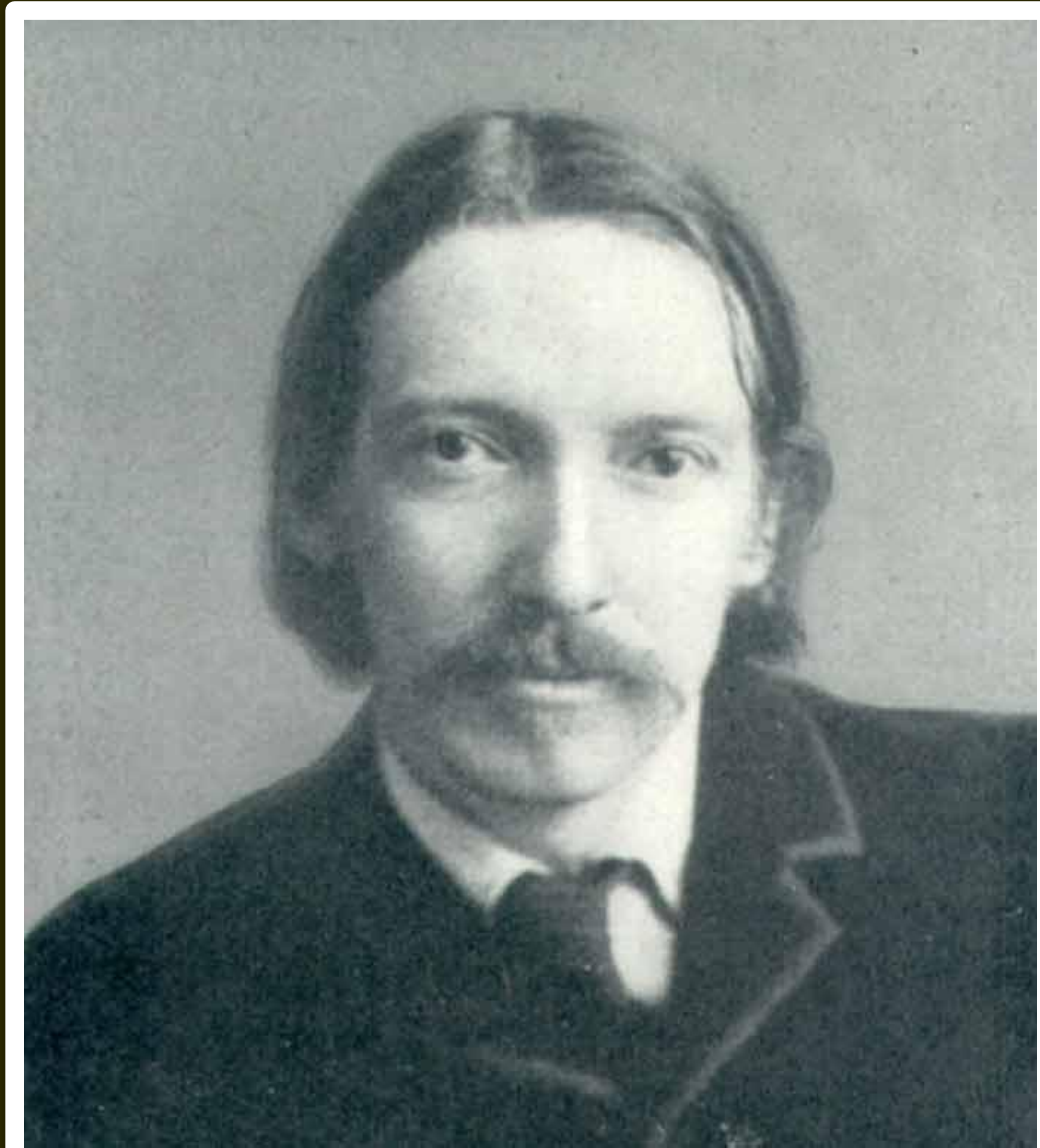

thirty one,

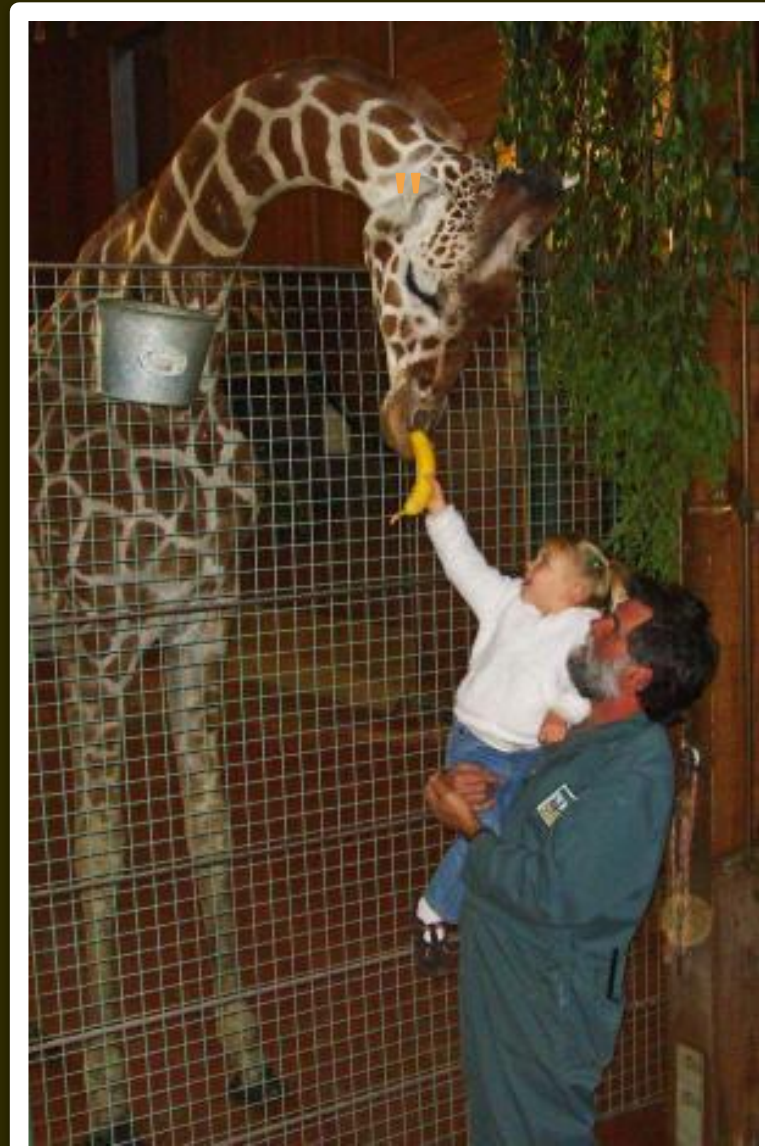

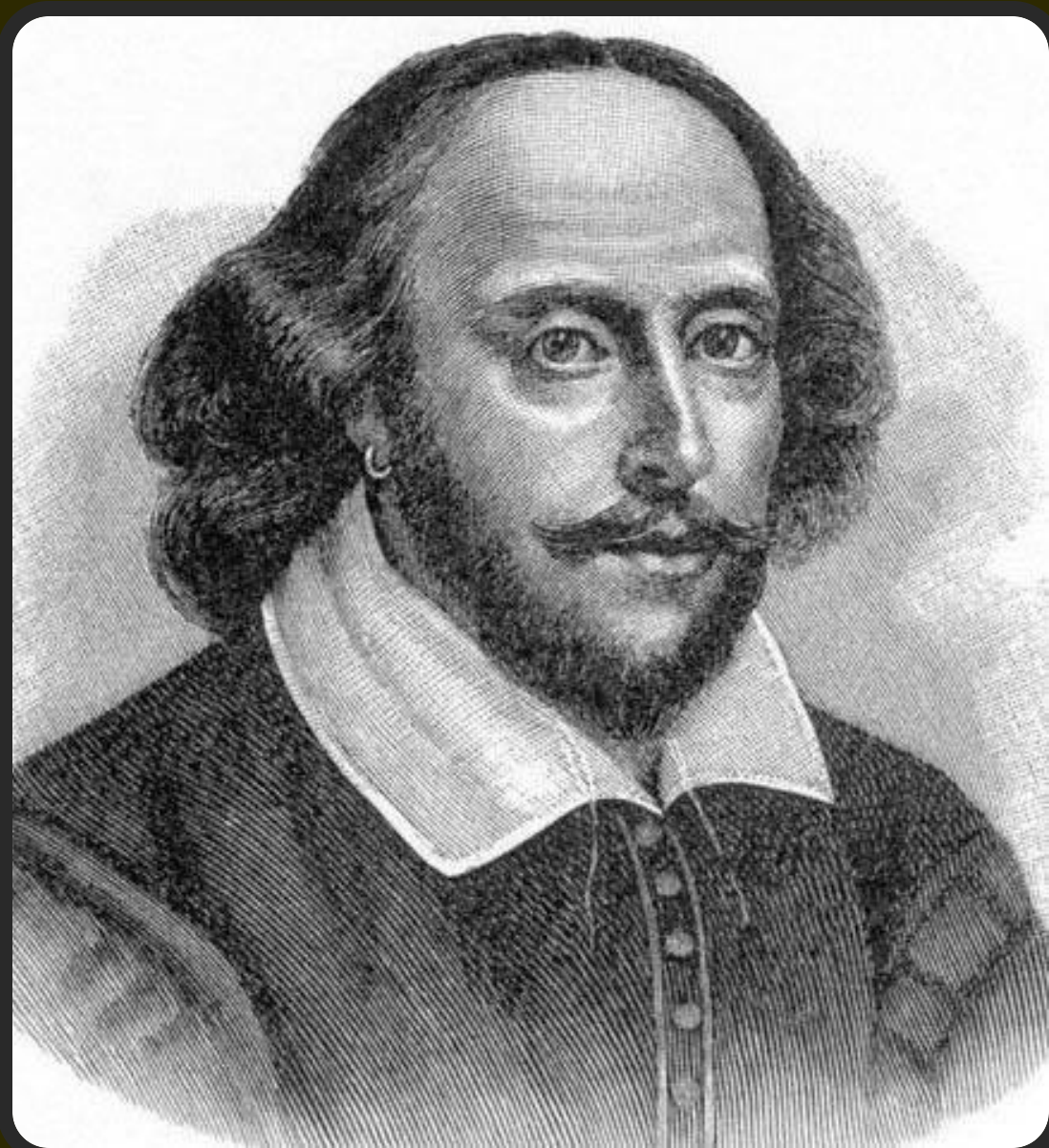

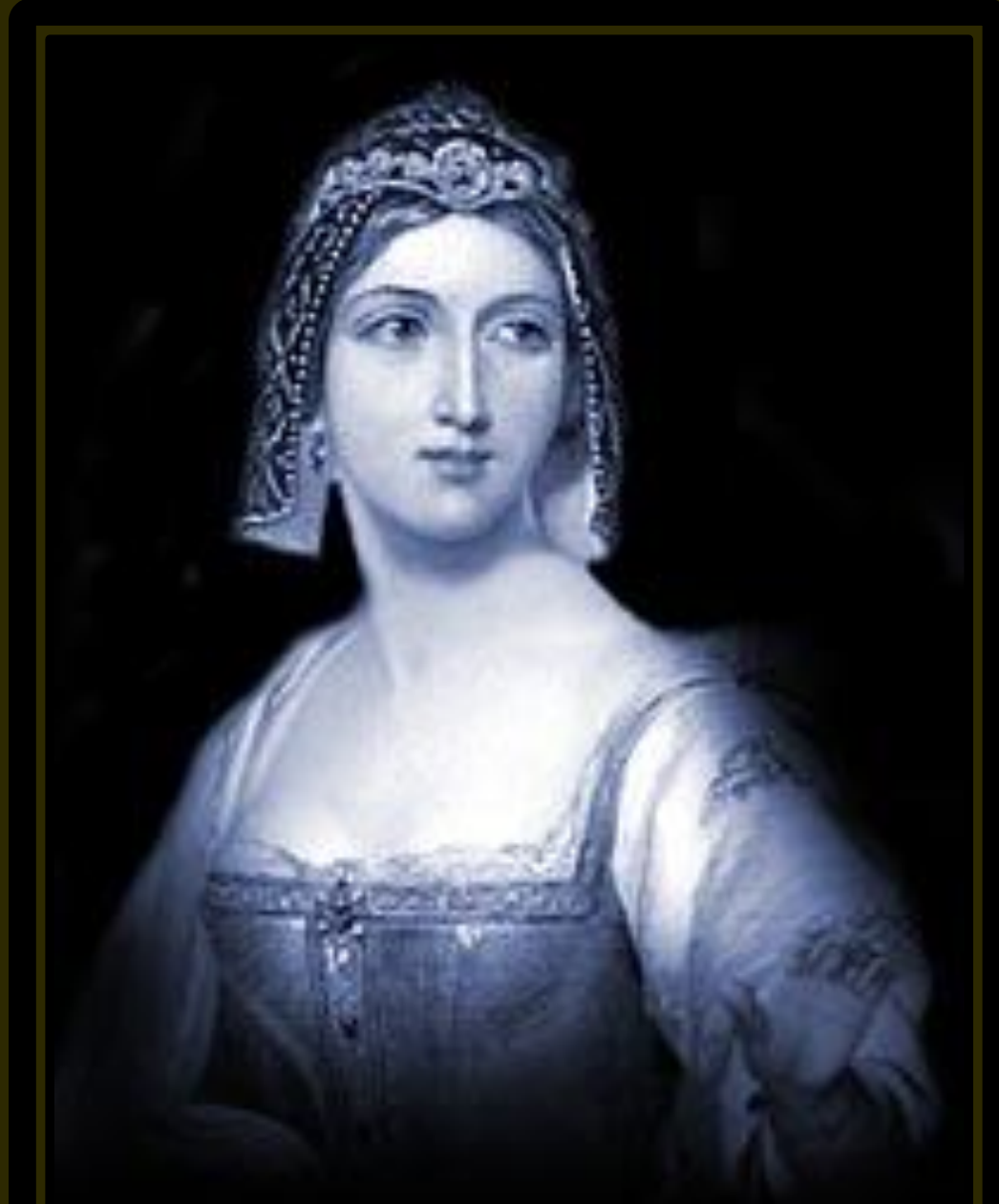
