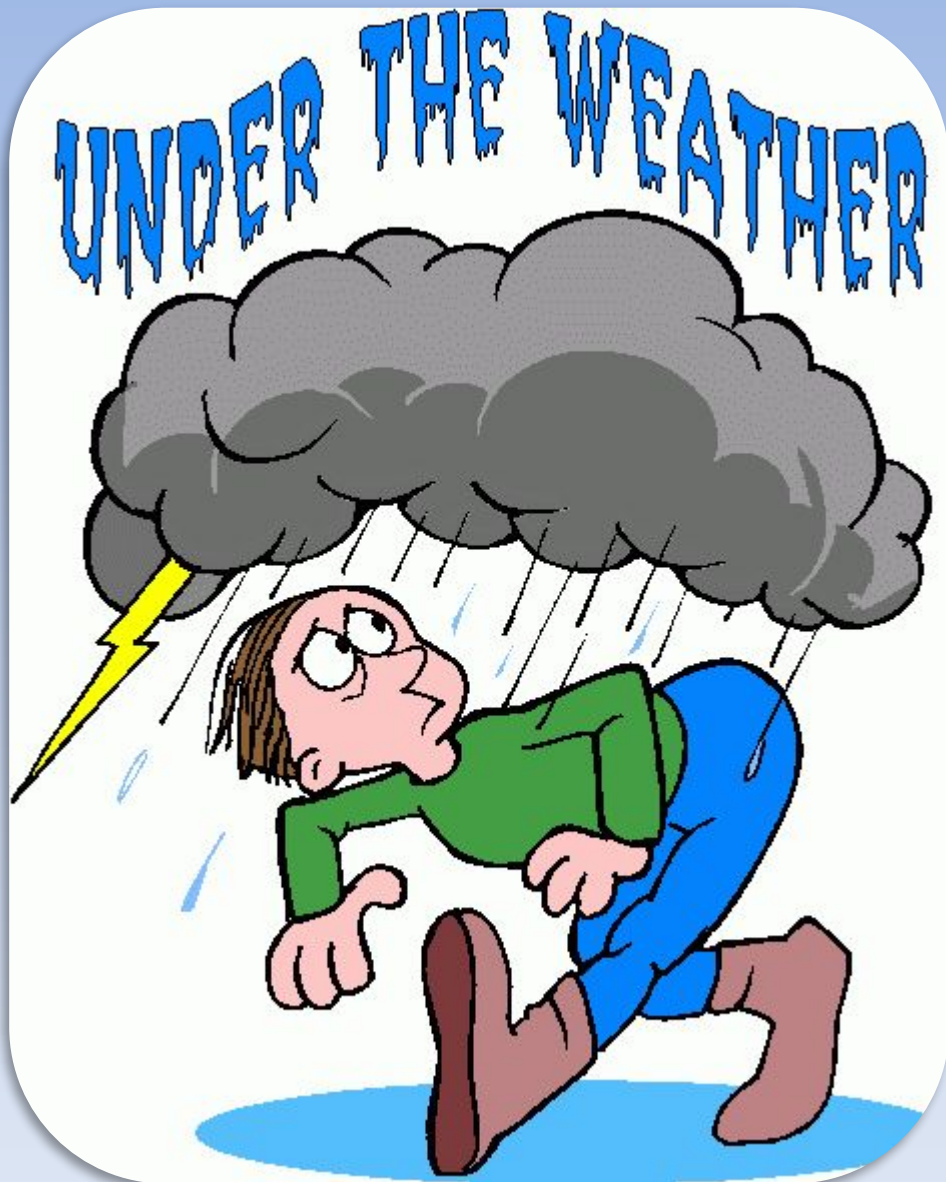

The English lyrics were first written as a poem by Jane Taylor (1783–1824) and published with the title "The Star" in *Rhymes for the Nursery* by Jane and her sister Ann Taylor (1782-1866) in London in 1806.

"Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" is a popular English lullaby. The lyrics are from an early 19th-century English poem, "*The Star*" by Jane Taylor. The poem, which is in couplet form, was first published in 1806 in *Rhymes for the Nursery*, a collection of poems by Taylor and her sister Ann. It is sung to the tune of the French melody "Ah! vous dirais-je, Maman", which was published in 1761 and later arranged by Mozart for a famous set of variations. The English lyrics have six stanzas, although only the first is widely known.

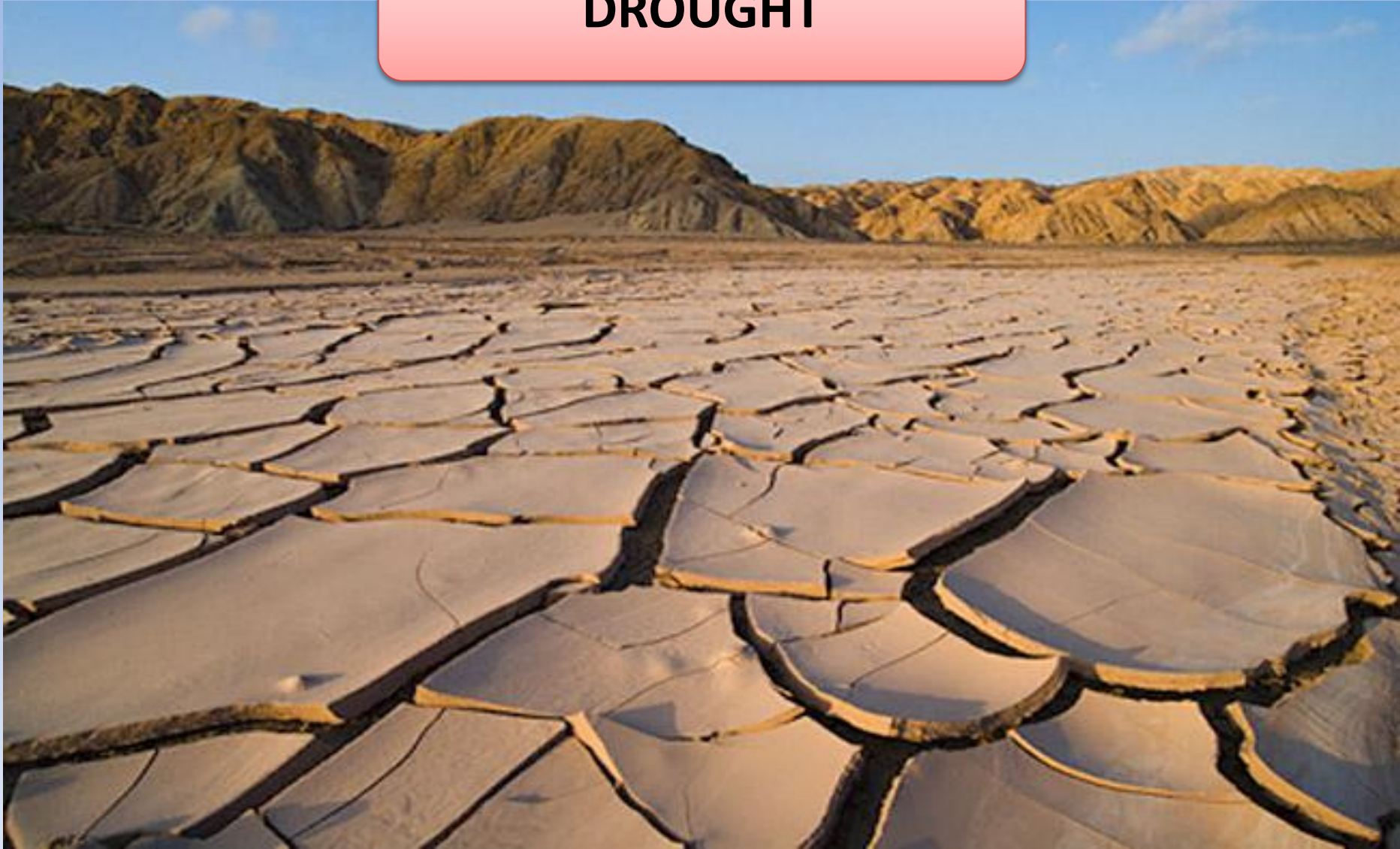
