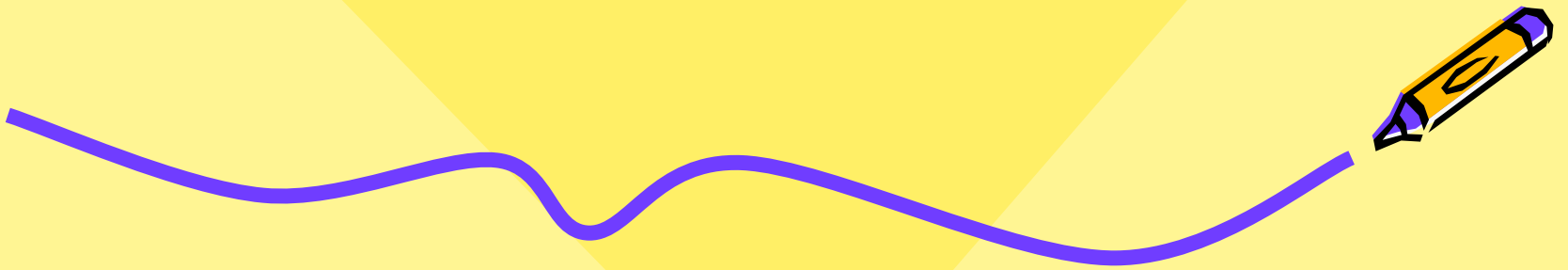

Present Perfect

He, she, it

+has

I, we, you, they

+have

+V₃ (V+ed)

*** V₃ - Past participle



Present Perfect Examples:



- I have never been to France.
- I have bought a book today
- Has he ever been in China?



Signal words

Already

yet

ever

never

just

before



already



- Already means that something happened earlier than we expected.
- With Present Perfect already usually goes after have or has and before the main verb or at the end of the sentence



Yet



- **Yet** means that something that we expected has happened or hasn't happened.
- **Yet** is used in negative statements and questions
- We usually put **yet** at the end of a sentence.



Yet



- Has he arrived **yet**?
- They haven't eaten **yet**.
- Have you met Judy **yet**?



Ever & never



- The adverbs **ever** and **never** express the idea of an unidentified time before now
- I have never visited Germany

'Ever' is used

- 1) in questions.

Have you ever been to England?

- 2) in negative questions
- Haven't you ever eaten Chinese food?



Ever & never

BE CAREFUL!

- You must not use **never** and **not** together:
- ~~*I haven't never been to Italy.*~~
- I have **never** been to Italy.



Just



- We use **JUST** to talk about actions that happened **recently**.

Dan and Kelly have **just** had a baby girl" (it means the baby was born a few days ago)



Before



- We use **before** to talk about actions that happened some times ago but nobody know when actually
- I have seen it **before**.
