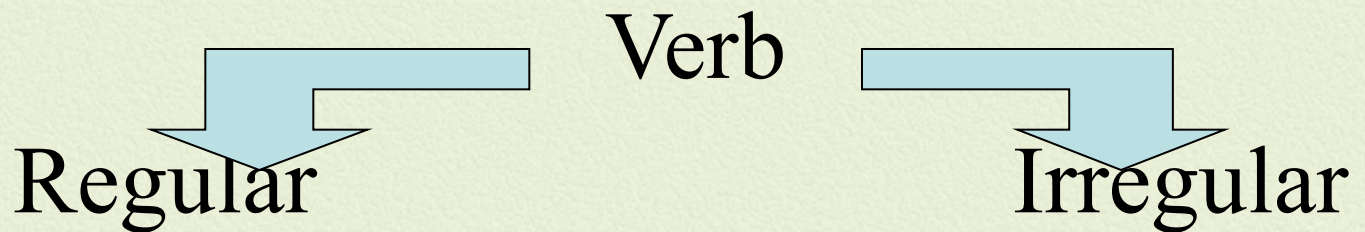


English Grammar

Verb

Verb shows an action and answers the question “What is to do?”.

Example: go, sleep, rest, work.



Regular verbs

A verb, that gets a new ending **-ed** in the Past.

1. When the verb ends with **-y** it changes to **-i**:

cry – cried

tidy - tidied

2. When the verb ends with **-e** it gets only **-d**:

like – liked

agree - agreed



Regular verbs

3. When the verb ends with the short stressed vowel and a consonant it gets the doubled consonant and -ed:

slip – slipped

stop - stopped



Regular verbs

But!

play – played

stay – stayed

enjoy - enjoyed



Irregular verbs

Irregular verb has different forms in the Present and the Past.

1. It gets –t or –d in the end:

burn – burnt

hear – heardd

2. It changes –d for –t:

spendd – spentt

sendd - sentt



Irregular verbs

3. It changes the vowel:

drive – drove

write – wrote

4. It makes the new ending:

keep – kept

sleep - slept



Irregular verbs

5. It doesn't change the form:

cut – cut

put – put

6. It gets the ending –ought:

bring – brought

catch - cought



Irregular verbs

But!

do – did

go – went

be – was/were
