### Adverb-CONDITIONAL (I)

if/when – clause main clause


If you don't listen carefully, you won't understand.

When you ring her up she will be happy.

main clause
You won't understand if you don't listen carefully.
She will be happy when you ring her up.


Conditional sentences consist of two parts:

• if – clause (Present Simple) which begins with the word if/when, and the main clause (Future Simple) which shows the result.






