



The USA got this Statue in 1884 from France. It was a birthday present! The Statue was built in France and transported by ships to the USA. The Statue is located on the Liberty Island. Seven spikes of the crown symbolize seven continents ( North and South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, Antarctica, Australia). In her left hand she is holding a tablet with the date July 4, 1776 ( the date of the independence from England.) In her right hand there is a torch which represents liberty.



It's on the north-west of Arizona. It attracts two million people a year. It's a hole in the ground made by Colorado River which still runs at the bottom. It's 350 km long and 6 and 29 km wide. The deepest place here is 1,600 meters deep











It is the home of the US Department of Defense. It's the biggest office building in the world. The length of each of the five sides of the building is 281 m, the perimeter is about 1405 m, the total length of the corridors is 28 km, the number of floors is 7, the height is 23 m, and the total area of the five floors is 604 000 m<sup>2</sup>. The building has 7754 windows. The building employs about 26,00 people.



It was build during the Depression. The building was the center of a competition between Walter Chrysler (Chrysler Corp.) and John Jakob Raskob (creator of General Motors) to see who could build the tallest building. The construction began on March 17, 1930. It's 1, 046 feet height and is supported by 60.00 tones of steel.



It was the first theme park. It was opened on July 17, 1955 and called "the happiest place in the world". The entrance ticket was just 1 dollar. Today pop-corn is free there and they uses 800,00 litres of paint every year.
