

An expression of time and a gerund often go after the verbs *spend* and *waste*.


The gerund always goes <u>after</u> the object or expression of place/time.

Other examples of verb + gerund:

Are you just going to sit there and watch that all day?

No, I won't spend a long time watching it. It was just too good to miss – the race is really competitive!

I have trouble sitting in front of the TV for just an hour. But I do like to spend my time entering online competitions! Look at the examples. Which type of word or expression is in each sentence?




