Future Simple

- * Подлежащее + Will + 1 ф. смыслового глагола
- * Подлежащее + Will not (won't) + 1 ф. смыслового глагола
- * Will + Подлежащее + 1 ф. смыслового глагола?

The **Future Simple** is used to

- * Make predictions based on what we know or believe
- * I believe that one day I will meet Brad Pitt.

- * Make promises
- * I'll clean up my room.

- * Make offers.
- * You don't need to take a taxi. I'll give you a lift.

- * Refer to decisions made at the moment of speaking
- * Thanks for the invitation. I'll be there.

Going to

- * Подлежащее + am/is/are + going to
- * Подлежащее + am/is/are + not+ going to
- * Am/is/are + подлежащее + going to?

The structure *going to* is used to

- * Make predictions based on what we know or believe
- * Many animals are going to disappear because of the changes of their habitats.

- * Make predictions based on what we can see or hear now
- * Look at those clouds. It's going to rain.

- * Talk about intentions
- * I'm going to study art when I leave the school.

Future Continuous

- * Подлежащее + will + be + смысловой глагол+ing
- * Подлежащее + will not (won't) + be + смысловой глагол+ing
- * Will + подлежащее + be + смысловой глагол+ing

The **Future Continuous** is used to talk about an activity that will be in progress at a certain time in the future

This time next year, I'll be travelling around Europe.

Future Perfect Simple

- * Подлежащее + Will + have + 3 ф. смыслового глагола
- * Подлежащее + Will + not + have + 3 ф. смыслового глагола
- * Will + Подлежащее + have + 3 ф. смыслового глагола?

Future Perfect Simple is used to talk about an activity that will be complete by a certain time in the future.

By 2020, I will have finished all my studies.

More ways to talk about the Future

Could, may and might are used to make predictions that we are less sure about

- * Tom could arrive at any time.
- * His second film might be better than the first.

The **Present Continuous** is used to talk about plans and arrangements

* I can't come this afternoon. I'm seeing the doctor.

The Present Simple is used to talk about timetables

- * The film starts at nine.

As soon as, when, until, before

- * If a sentence refers to the future, we use the present simple tense after conjunctions **as soon as, when, until and before**.
- * I'll do it as soon as I get home.
