# When we use reported speech

and the main verb of the sentence is present (Tom <u>says</u> that...)

The rest of the sentence is usually present too:

Tom <u>says</u> that he <u>is feeling</u> ill.

#### You want to tell somebody else what Tom said.



You can repeat Tom's words (*direct* speech): Tom said 'I'm feeling ill.' Or you can use *reported* speech: Tom said that he was feeling ill.

# When we use reported speech

and the main verb of the sentence is past (Tom <u>said</u> that...).

The rest of the sentence is usually past too:

Tom <u>said</u> that he <u>was</u> <u>feeling</u> ill.

# Tense changing

- Present Simple
- Future Simple
- Past Simple
- Present Perfect

Past Simple

- Future-in-the-past (Would + V1)
- Past Perfect
- Past Perfect

In general, the <u>Present</u> form in <u>direct speech</u> changes to the <u>Past</u> form in <u>reported speech</u>:

- am/is -> <u>was</u>
- are -> were
- do/does -> did
- have/has ->had
- shall -> should
- will -> would
- can -> could
- may -> might
- must -> <u>had to</u>

### Remember

- today -> that day
- tonight -> that night
- yesterday -> the day before
- tomorrow -> the next day
- (a week)ago -> (a week) before
- last year -> the year before
- next year -> the following year
- now -> then
- here -> there
- this -> that
- these -> those

| " <u>What</u> did you do    | Tell me <u>what</u> you had          |
| yesterday?"                 | done yesterday.                      |
| " <u>When</u> will you come | Tell me <u>when</u> you              |
| home?"                      | would come home.                     |
| " <u>Who</u> won the game?" | Tell me <u>who</u> had won the game. |
