

Present Simple

- -repeated actions
- -Habits

+	He looks happy.
-	He doesn't look happy.
?	Does he look happy?

- + They look happy.
- They don't look happy Do they look happy?

Present Continuous

- -Actions that are happening right now
- -Near future

+	We're staying here.
-	We aren't staying here.
?	Are we staying here?

- + She is staying/I am staying.
- She isn't staying/I am not staying. Is she staying?/ Am I staying?

Past Simple

- -Completed actions in the past
- -Exact time is mentioned

+	They worked hard.
-	They didn't work hard.
?	Did they work hard?

Past Continuous

- -Actions that were happening for some time in the past
- -not completed action

+	I was living there during the 90s.
-	I wasn't living there during the 90s.
?	Were you living there?

state verbs and dynamic verbs

State verbs are not usually used in the continuous form. The most common state verbs are:

- · attitude verbs: love, hate, like, want, prefer
- thinking verbs: believe, know, remember, understand, mean, imagine
- sense verbs: see, hear, sound, appear, seem
- belonging verbs: own, possess, belong to, have, contain, include

I am not believing you.
I don't believe you.
