The resolution on renaming the university was signed by Nikolai Vinogradov, head of the Vladimir region. According to the document, the name of the Stoletovs was given to the university in order to perpetuate the memory of outstanding countrymen who made a great contribution to the development of domestic research in the field of physics and the liberation of Bulgaria from the Ottoman yoke.
