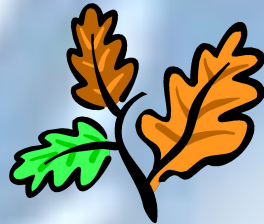

Traditions and Customs

Christmas is celebrated in all over the world. In Britain people have many interesting Christmas traditions. They decorate Christmas trees and their homes, give presents to each other, have traditional Christmas dinner. All children like this wonderful time because it is the time of much fun. Christmas Eve is on the 24th of December. On this day everybody is busy and in a hurry. Offices close at 1 o'clock, but the shops stay open late. Children hang their stockings and wait for Santa Claus. Everybody gives and receives Christmas cards and Christmas boxes.



Symbols of Christmas



1. Christmas Tree

Before Christmas people put the evergreen tree in their homes and decorate it. They place a large shining star at the top of the Christmas tree and many bright shining balls (red, blue, yellow, green, silver) from top to bottom.



2. Santa Claus

The Dutch were the first to speak of a merry old man in red and white clothes, with eight flying reindeer. He lived near the North Pole, filled stockings with presents, and came down the chimney. They called him Sinter Klaas.

3. Christmas Stockings

In the evening of the 24th of December children hang their Christmas stockings on their beds or put them under the Christmas tree. Santa Claus puts presents into them. A Christmas stocking is not a real stocking. It is big and beautifully decorated.
