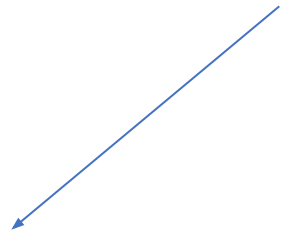

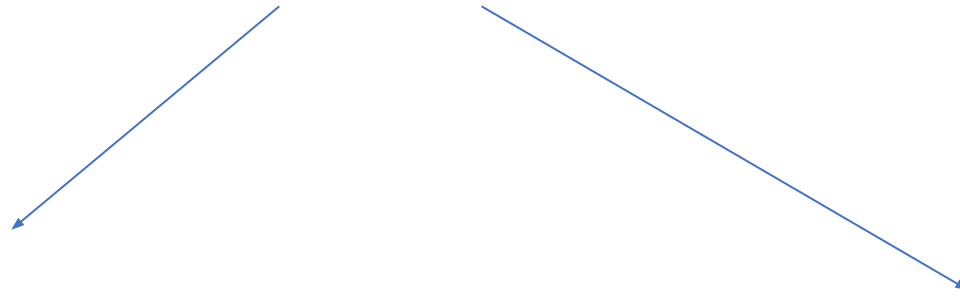

## A Countable Noun

consists of people, places, things, or ideas that can be counted.



apple

## Uncountable Noun

are not individual objects and cannot be counted.



sugar



milk
