ACTION AND NON-ACTION VERBS

Also called DYNAMIC and STATIVE verbs

NON -ACTION VERBS: STATE

◆ A state is when something stays the same.

 Non-action verbs are <u>normally</u> not used in the continuous form

An action is when something happens





VERBS THAT CAN EXPRESS ACTION AND NON- ACTION

It is possible for some verbs to express state and action IF THEY HAVE TWO DIFFERENT MEANINGS



VERBS THAT CAN EXPRESS STATE AND ACTION

HAVE

Action:

"He's having a shower" (=taking)

State: "He has a house

in London"



VERBS THAT CAN EXPRESS STATE AND ACTION

THINK

"He thinks Obama will win the

next elections"
(opinion = state)



"What are you thinking now?" (action)
