

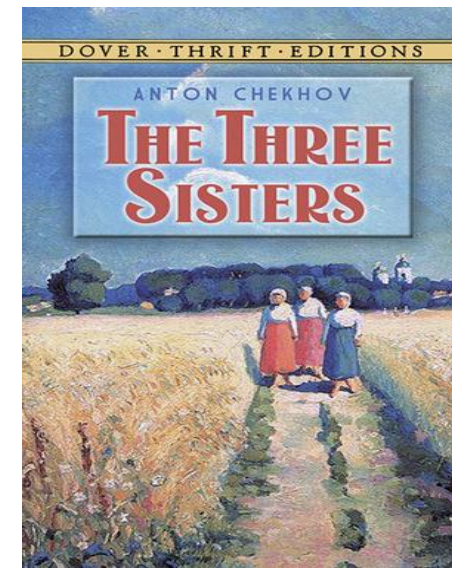
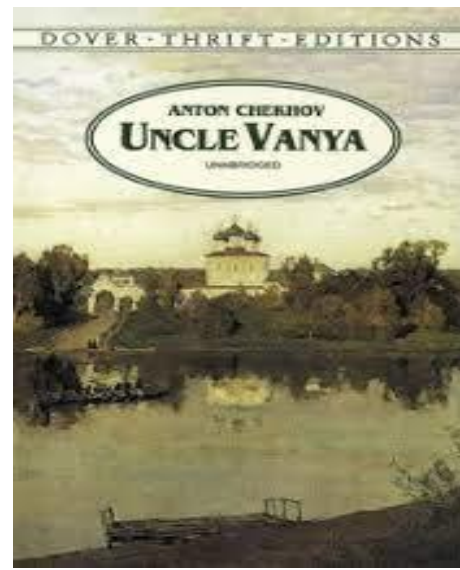
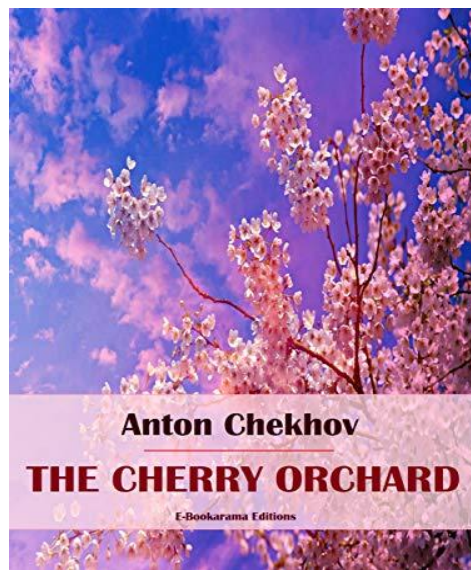
Taganrog birthplace of Anton Chekhov
