BASE OF THE TONGUE

Stephen Permsky created the ancient Komi alphabet of 24 letters in 1372, which Anbur named after the first two letters.



ALPHABET

The alphabet has been transformed over the years. The modern Komi alphabet is based on the Russian-based alphabet, developed by Molodtsov. He created the first ABC book for Komi schools

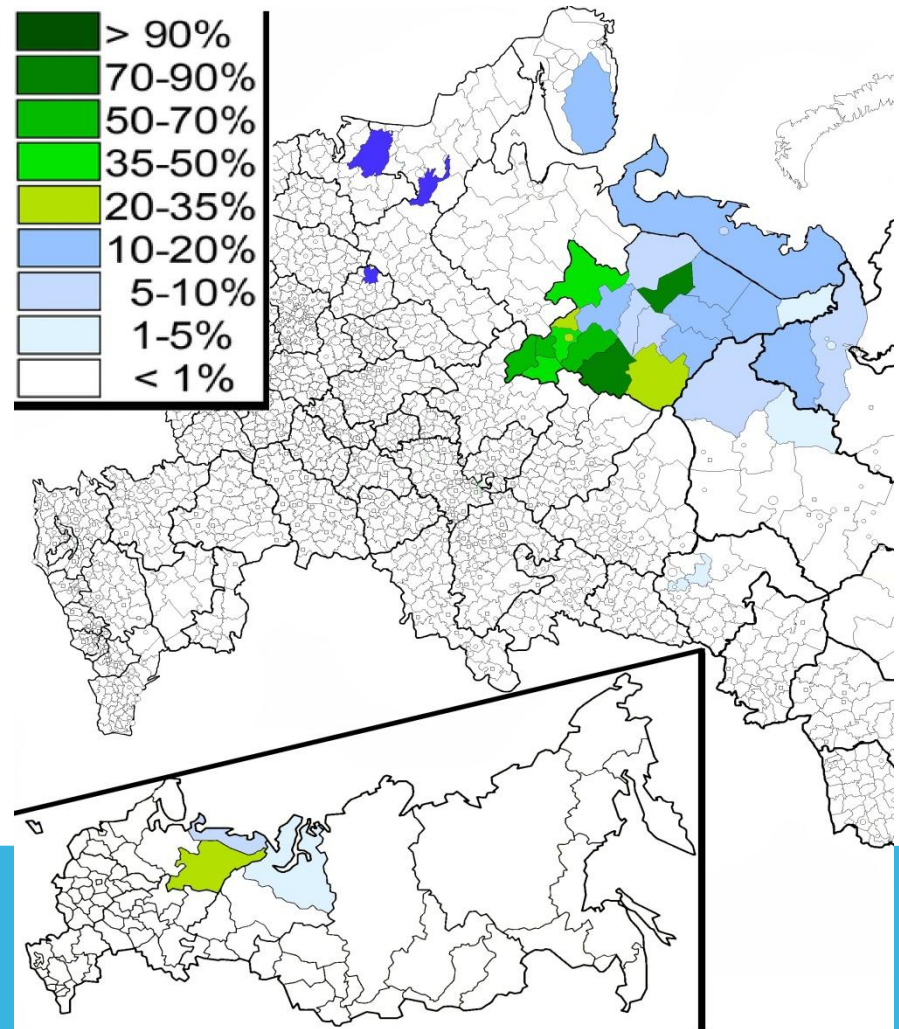
TYPES OF DIALECTS

Komi is one of the Perm languages (the Finno-Ugric branch of the Uralic family). It has the Syktyvkar, Nizhnevychegodsky, Verkhnevychegodsky, Srednesysolsky, Verkhnesysolsky, Vymsky, Luzsko-Lettsky, Izhemsky, Pechora and Udora dialects.



WHERE IS THE KOMI LANGUAGE SPOKEN?

Komi is widespread in the Komi Republic and the Perm Territory, partly in the northeast of the Kirov region, on the Kola Peninsula, in the Nenets, Yamalo-Nenets and Khanty-Mansi Authors. districts of the Russian Federation. The number of speakers is 156,099.
