2. The European Architecture of the Post Renaissance (the Baroque) period

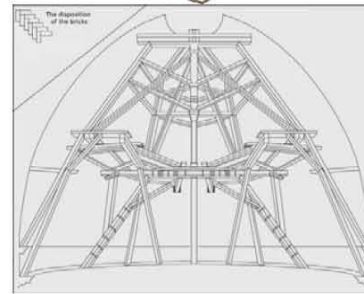
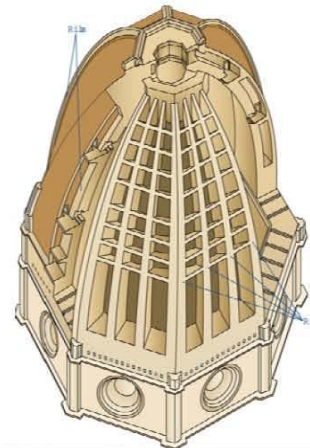

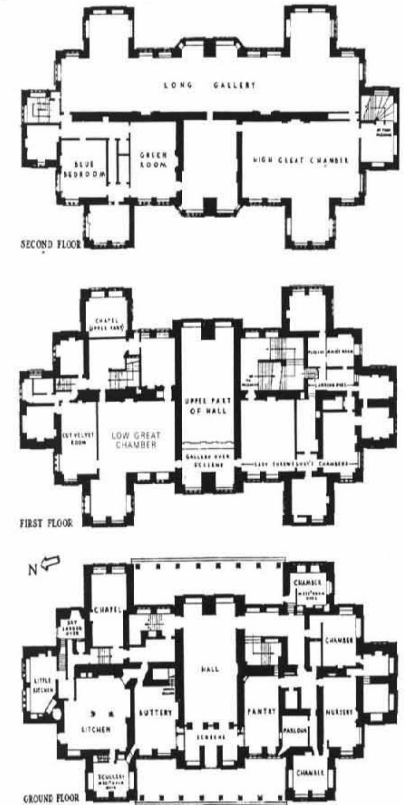


Fig. 9. Hardwick Hall Ground, first and second-floor plans.

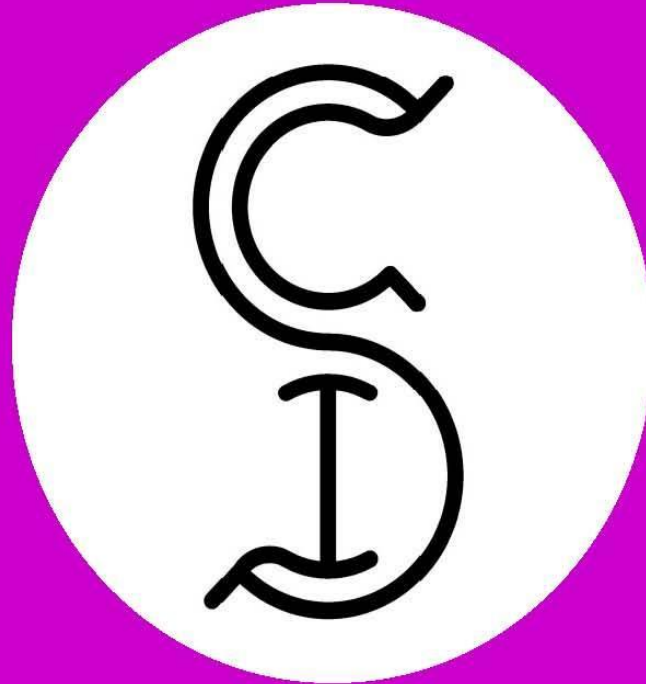
