



London is the capital and largest city of the United Kingdom of great Britain and Northern Ireland.



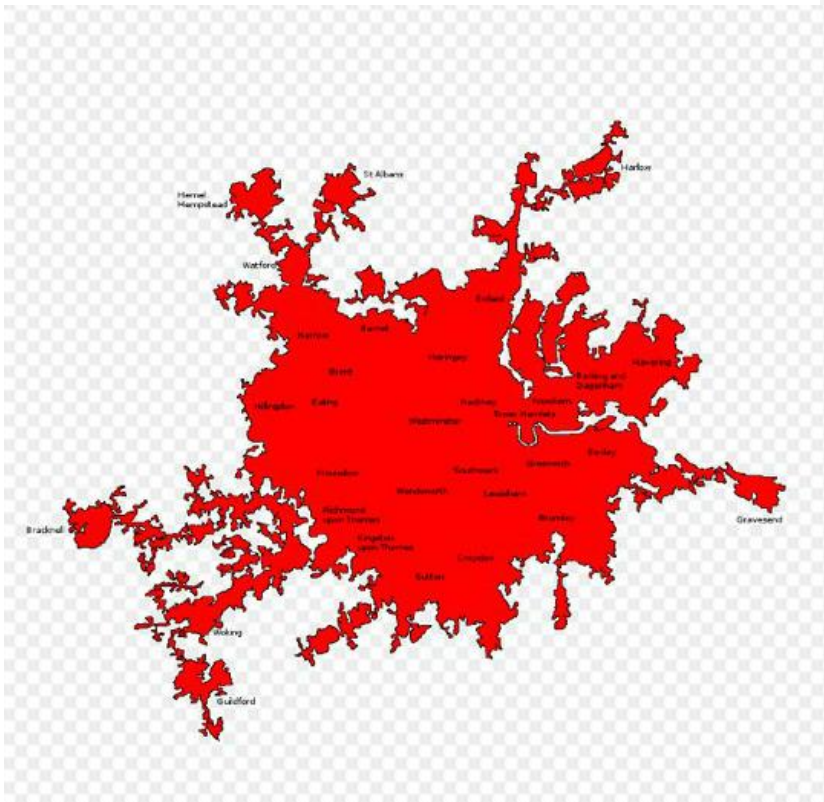


- London is the leading financial centre for international business and trade and, along with new York and Tokyo is one of three "command centers" of the global economy

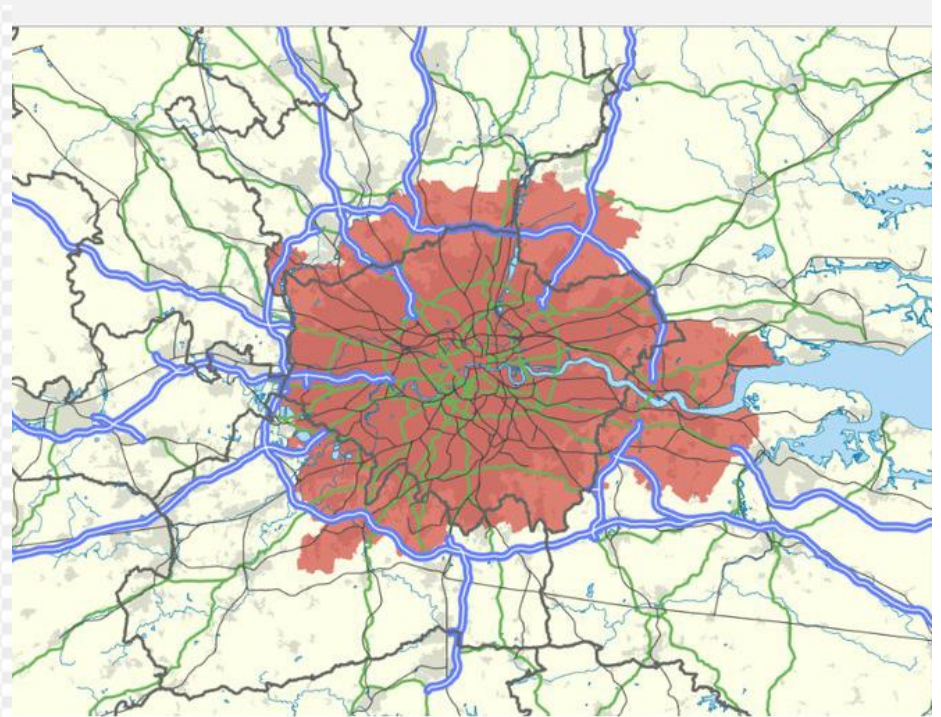


# London

Administrative forms a region of England greater London, divided into 33 self-governing territory. The population is 8.6 million people (2015) is the third largest city of Europe. Forms a conurbation greater London and the wider Metropolitan area.

flows into the North sea, forming the estuary.



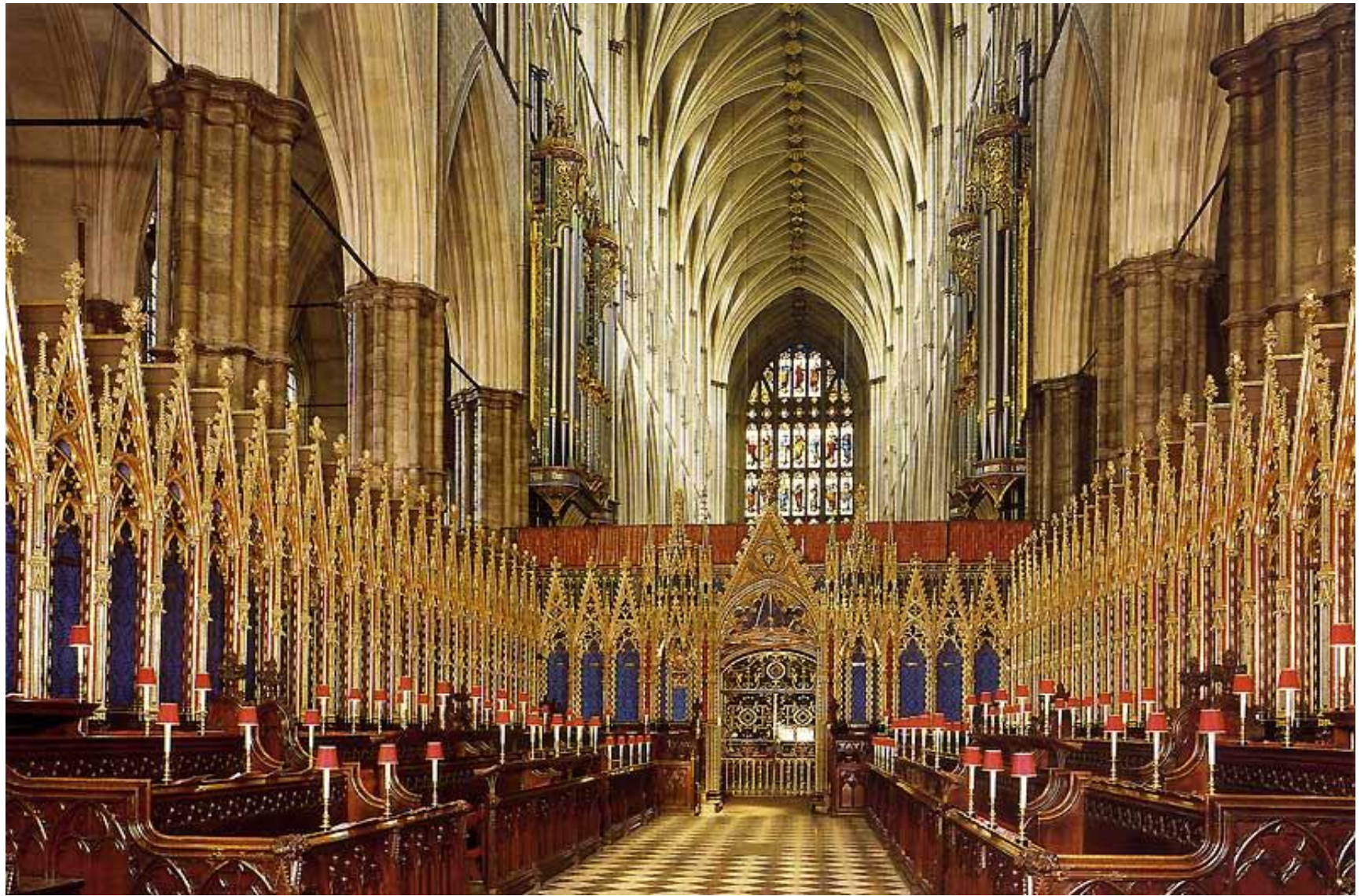
London is one of the global cities of the highest rank and the world's leading financial centers. Its economy is one-fifth of the country's economy.



- Westminster is situated on the left Bank of the Thames, to the West of the city of London.

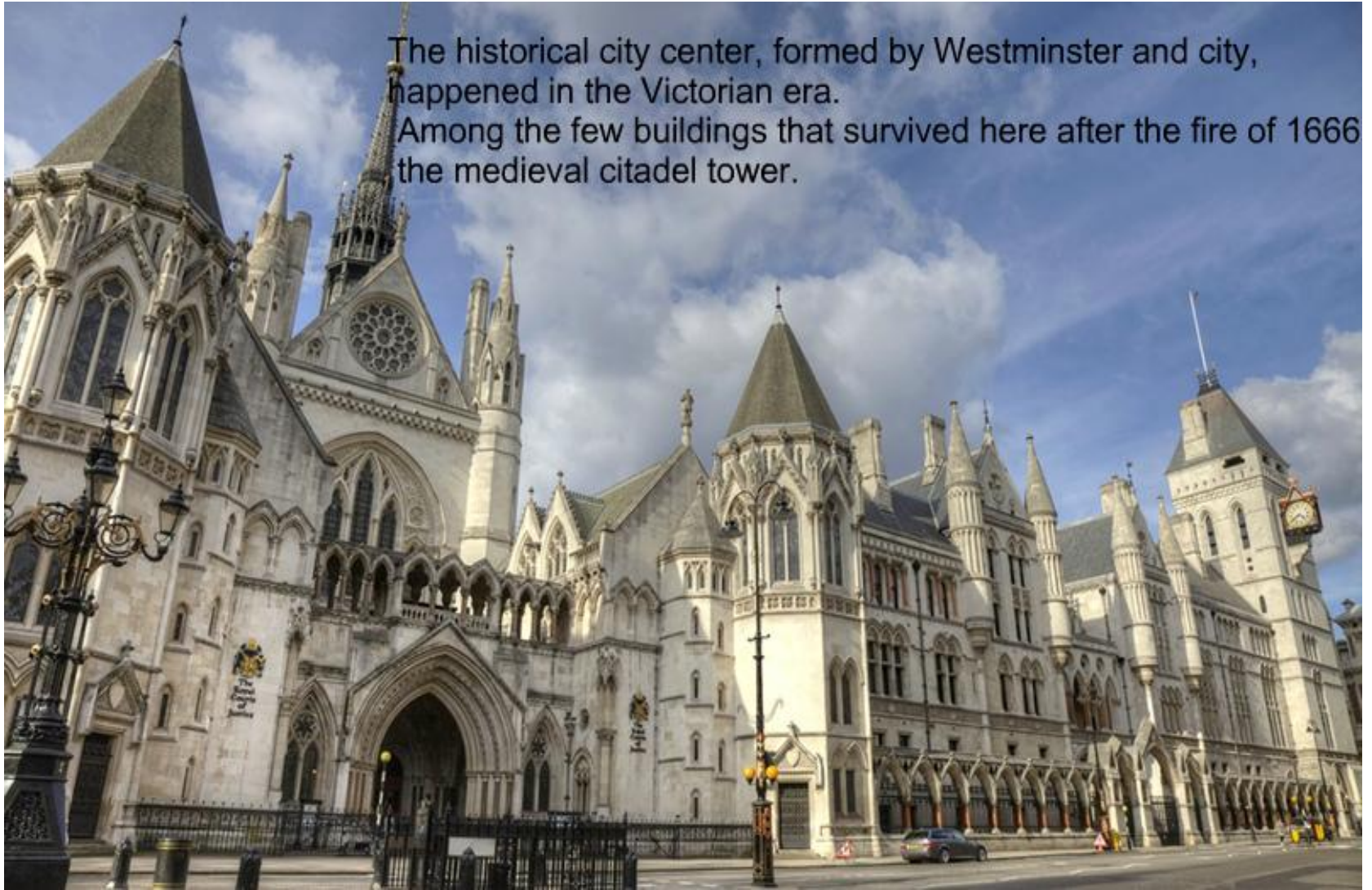








The historical city center, formed by Westminster and city, happened in the Victorian era. Among the few buildings that survived here after the fire of 1666 the medieval citadel tower.
