

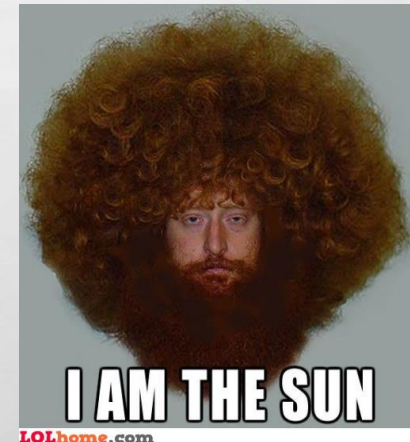

# SOMETHING NEEDS DOING

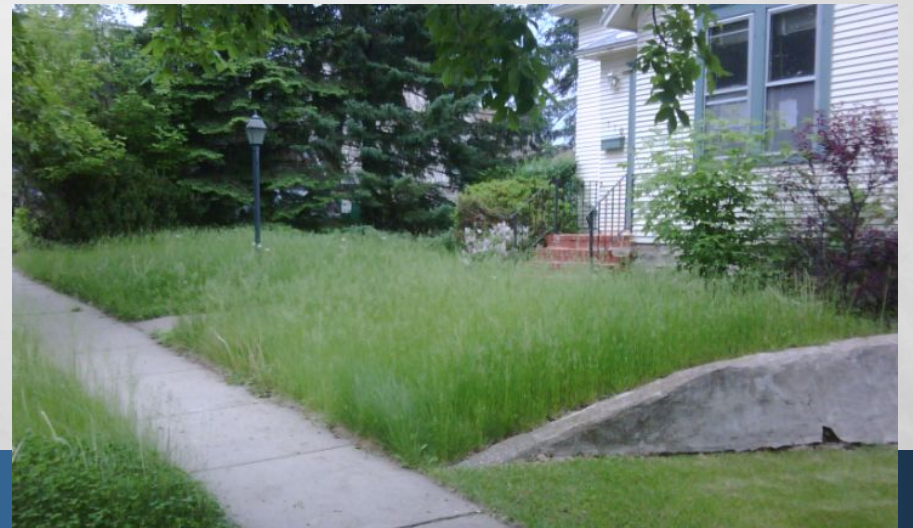
- IF YOU THINK THAT YOU NEED TO DO SOMETHING, AND IT WOULD BE BEST TO ASK SOMEONE ELSE TO DO IT, YOU CAN SAY THAT ***SOMETHING NEEDS DOING***

- **TAKE THIS GUY FOR EXAMPLE....**
- **HIS HAIR IS VERY LONG AND MESSY, AND I THINK IT WOULD BE A GOOD IDEA FOR HIM TO VISIT THE HAIRDRESSER.**
- **IN THIS CASE WE COULD SAY *HIS HAIR NEEDS CUTTING***

# HAVE/GET SOMETHING DONE

- **NOW THAT YOU KNOW HOW TO SAY THAT SOMETHING NEEDS DOING, LET'S LOOK AT HAVING THINGS DONE.**
- **WE USE *HAVE/GET SOMETHING DONE* WHEN SOMEONE DOES SOMETHING FOR US, OR THEY DO SOMETHING BAD TO US**

# HAVE SOMETHING DONE FORMAT

- **SUBJECT + “HAVE” + OBJECT + PAST PARTICIPLE**
- **THEY ARE HAVING THEIR WINDSCREEN REPLACED**
- **YOU CAN ALSO USE “GET” INSTEAD OF “HAVE”. THEY ARE INTERCHANGEABLE**





- **THIS MAN IS BEING PUNCHED, AND IT ISN'T MUCH FUN. IN OTHER WORDS, SOMEONE IS DOING SOMETHING BAD/UNPLEASANT TO HIM. IN THIS SITUATION, WE COULD SAY...**

- ***HE GOT HIS FACE PUNCHED!***



- **THIS PERSON IS AT THE HAIRDRESSER AND THE HAIRDRESSER IS CUTTING HER HAIR FOR HER (BECAUSE YOU WOULDN'T DO IT YOURSELF)**
- **IN THIS CASE WE CAN SAY.**
- ***SHE IS HAVING HER HAIR CUT***



**TRY TO DESCRIBE THESE PICTURES USING  
THE ABOVE PATTERN....**





- **HE IS HAVING HIS TEETH CHECKED**
- **HE GOT HIS TEETH CLEANED**



# WE CAN USE “HAVE/GET” IN MANY DIFFERENT TENSES...

- **SHE IS HAVING HER CHILD VACCINATED**
- **SHE HAS HAD HER CHILD VACCINATED**
- **SHE IS GOING TO GET HER CHILD VACCINATED**





- **THE ELDERLY WOMAN IS GETTING HER BLOOD PRESSURE TAKEN**
- **SHE HAS GOT HER BLOOD PRESSURE TAKEN**
- **SHE WAS GETTING HER BLOOD PRESSURE TAKEN WHEN THE DOCTOR SUDDENLY SAID “OH DEAR....”**
