- When do the students study pre-clinical subjects?

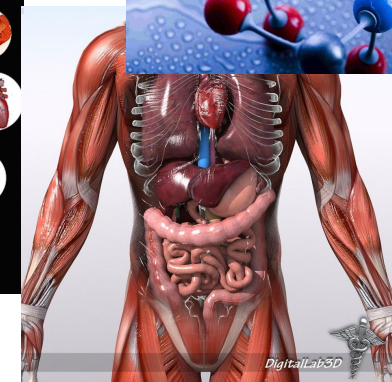
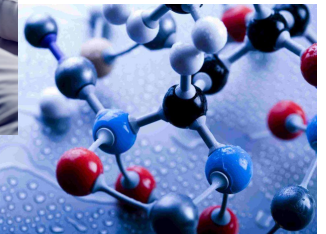
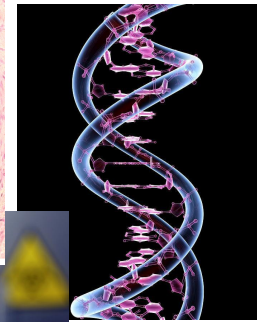
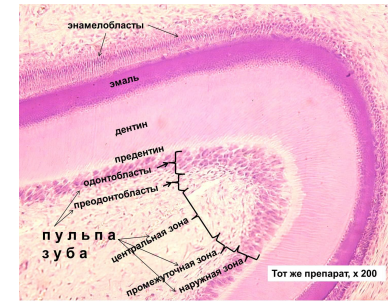
The first two years of dental school are pre-clinical

-What are the students taught during sessions?

These sessions are designed to teach students everything involved in different dental jobs and includes the following.

- Making crowns and dentures
- Making bridges and waxups
- How to restore and drill teeth



-When do lectures start and finish?

Dental school lectures start every day at 8 a.m. and finishes at 5 p.m.

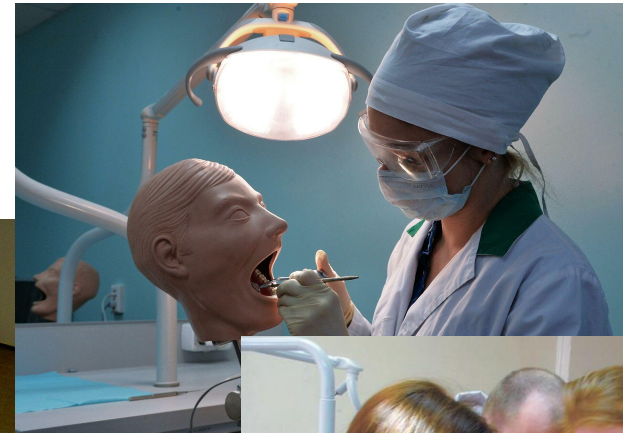
-Why do the students stay at school until 10 p.m.?

On most days, students stay at school until 10 p.m as they need to practice in the simulation clinic and work



-When do the students take part in clinical exercises?

Students take part in clinical exercises during the latter part of their studies. Additionally, they may start performing dental procedures.



-When are the students awarded the titles?

After completing the program, students are awarded the title of either Doctor of Dental Medicine or Doctor of Dental Surgery.



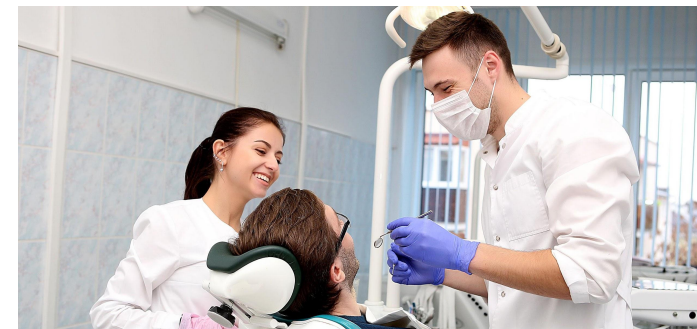
-What dental specialties are there in Canada?
