Oxford attractions:

Oxford Castle

- ▣ Oxford castle is a large, partially ruined, medieval Norman castle in Oxford, and was built in the Western part of the city, on the banks of the river ISIS (the name of the Thames on the site of Oxford).



The Merton College

- ▣ The oldest college at Oxford University, founded in 1264 by Walter de Merton, bishop of Rochester, and then Lord Chancellor of England, to train priests.

Brighton attractions: The Royal pavilion

- ▣ The former seaside residence of the kings of great Britain, the monument of "Indo-Saracenic" style 1810-ies.



Brighton Museum & Art Gallery

- ▣ Brighton Museum & Art Gallery is a municipally-owned public museum and art gallery in the city of Brighton and Hove in the South East of England. It is part of "Royal Pavilion & Museums, Brighton and Hove".

Portsmouth



Portsmouth attractions: Spinnaker Tower

- ▣ Spinnaker tower-tower with a height of 170 meters above sea level and 2.5 times higher than Nelson's column; is the tallest building in the UK outside of London and the centre for the reconstruction of the port of Portsmouth.



Kings Theatre

- ▣ Theatre in Southsea, Portsmouth which opened on 30th September 1907. It is operated by the Kings.

Reading attractions: Reading Abbey

- ▣ Large, ruined abbey in the centre of the town of Reading, in the English county of Berkshire. It was founded by Henry I in 1121.



Southampton



Southampton attractions: Bargate

- ▣ The building is a scheduled monument, which served as a temporary exhibition and a space for Southampton Solent University.



God's House Tower

- ▣ Tower of God's house- was built in the 13th century, it stands on the southeast corner of the city walls, and allowed access to the city platform and the city waterfront.
