Fund-Raising for Arts' Sake, to Restore Space

HE Westchester Arts Council has embarked on a \$5 million capital campaign to renovate and restore the nine-story building it bought from Chase Manhattan Bank in 1999 and now uses as its headquarters. Nearly \$3 million has been raised so far in the private phase of the campaign, which began two

Plans include building artists' studios and office suites for arts-related businesses on the eighth floor of the 73-year-old former bank building, an official national historic landmark now known as the Arts Exchange; establishing a cultural tourism cen-ter on the lobby floor, which is also used for er on the lobby floor, which is also updat-art exhibits and performances; and updat-

also expects to use \$1 million for an endomment to support workshops and other services to artists and cultural groups.
