Founded 1907 by Royal Charter

- to develop and exploit the natural resources of the Commonwealth

Combined the Royal College of Science, Royal School of Mines and the City and Guilds College

Built on the site of the 1851 Great Exhibition Show Ground

1925 joined the University of London

- renamed to Imperial College of Science and Technology

1950 massive expansion and building programme

Demolition of Imperial Institute, except Queens Tower and start of construction of new buildings over 20 years
