And Clemens. He took his penname from the word "to mark" and "twain" which were used by leadsmen on the steamboats to mark the depth of two fathoms.


Besides being a humorist, Mark twain is also a realist- the author of biting satires and bitterly critical pages revealing a good deal of the truth about American way of life.








# The Gilded Age

The name of the novel is an ironic reinterpretation of the traditional image of Golden Age, which in American history was gilded only




## The Prince and the

wThe Prince and the Pauper vis a novel which was first published in Salar Canada, before its 1882 publication in the United States. The novel represents Twain's first attempt at historical fiction.

Set in 1547, it tells the story of two young boys who are identical in appearance: Tom Canty, a pauper who lives with his abusive father in Offal Court off Pudding Lane in London, and Prince Edward, son of King Henry VIII.

It describes with irony the flaws and absurdities of the English imperfect state









