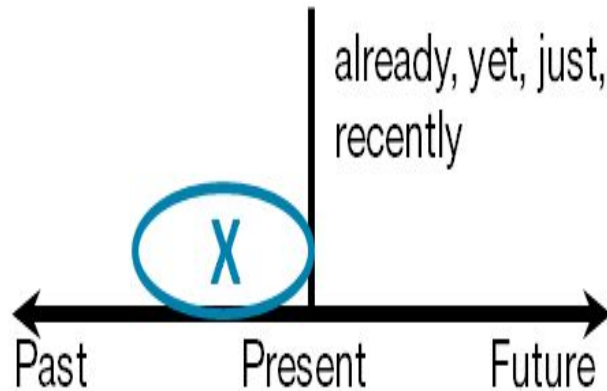

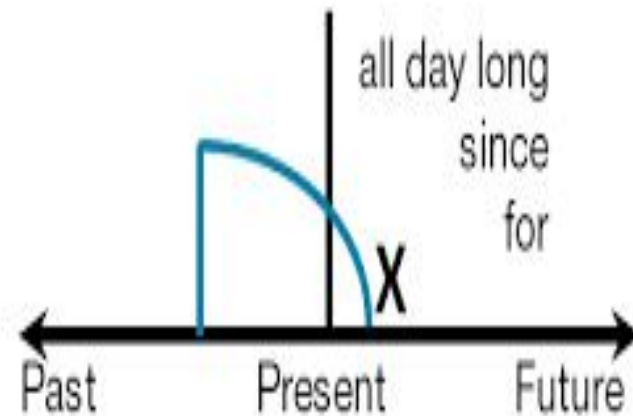
# Present Perfect vs. Present Perfect Continuous

have/has + Past Participle

## Present Perfect Continuous Tense



have/has been + Verb-ing

# Present Perfect



I **have done** my homework.



I **haven't done** my homework.



**Have you done** your homework?

# Present Perfect Continuous



I **have been waiting** for you.



I **haven't been waiting** for you.




**Have you been waiting** for me?


1. Present Perfect - это действие, которое **завершилось к моменту речи и его результат имеет значение в настоящий момент.**

**ever** когда-либо

**never** никогда

**just** только что

**already** уже

**lately** недавно

**yet** ещё

**by now** к этому времени

**up to now** до сих пор

this morning/afternoon/evening,**

Время **Present Perfect Continuous** указывает на действие, которое началось в прошлом, продолжалось в течение некоторого времени и либо закончилось непосредственно перед разговором или все еще продолжается в момент разговора.

**I have been waiting** here for 2 hours!

Я прождал здесь два часа!

**We have been preparing** for our exam since morning.

Мы готовились к экзамену с самого утра.

Указатели времени (сигналы),  
употребляемые с Present Perfect Continuous :

- **For** – в течение
- **Since** – с, с тех пор как
- **All day** (all my life,... ) – весь день ( всю ЖИЗНЬ, ... )
- **Recently** - недавно
- **Lately** – в последнее время
- **For a long time** - долго

# Important notes

**1) Present Perfect** употребляется вместо **Present Perfect Continuous** с глаголами, которые не употребляются в длительной форме.

К ним относятся глаголы, обозначающие ментальный процесс (**know** - знать, **like** - нравиться, **understand** - понимать, **believe** - верить, **need** - нуждаться) и глаголы, которые выражают чувства и эмоции (**hear** - слышать, **smell** - нюхать, **taste** - чувствовать вкус, **hate** - ненавидеть, **want** - хотеть), глаголы состояния (**be**-быть, **have**-иметь)

- Brenda **has been watching** cartoons since 3 o'clock.

- My dad \_\_\_\_\_ (already/watch) the latest news.
- My dad **has already watched** the latest news.
- His elder sister \_\_\_\_\_ (yet/not/tidy up) her room.
- His elder sister **hasn't tidied up** her room **yet**.

- Alice \_\_\_\_\_ (feed) her baby for twenty minutes already.
- Alice **has been feeding** her baby for twenty minutes already.
