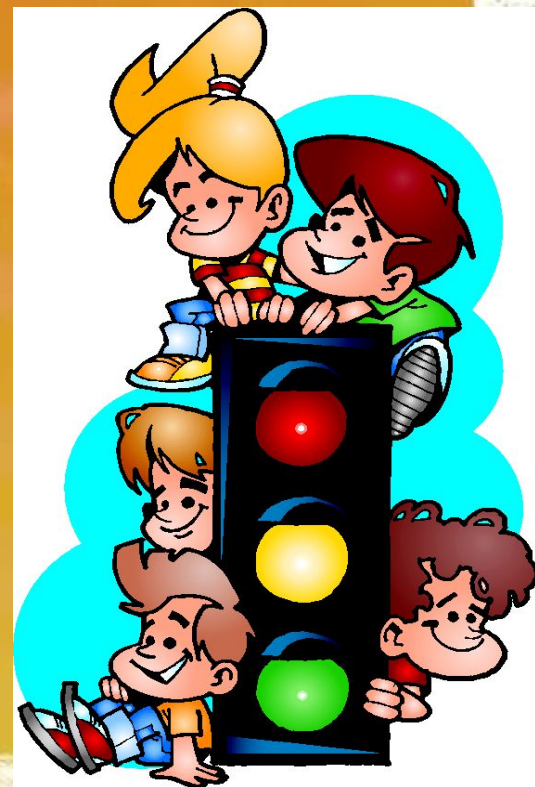


# *What are we going to speak at the lesson?*

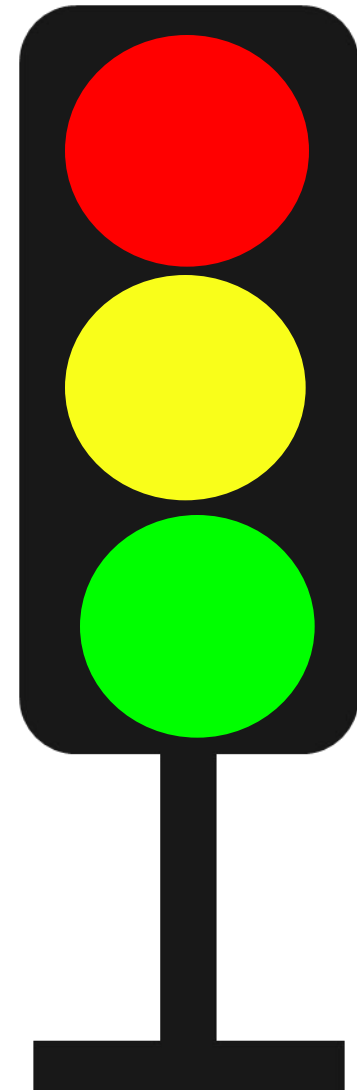
