

An adverb is a word used to modify a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.

Ex. Quickly and suddenly are adverbs.

<u>Adjective + ly = adverb</u>

Ex. Quick+ ly = quickly sudden + ly = suddenly bad + ly = badly careful + ly = carefully

<u>y – ily</u>

easy = easily heavy = heavily

Adverbs tell you how something happens or how somebody does something:

Please listen carefully.

I opened the door <u>slowly.</u>
