

ADVERBS



An adverb is a word used to modify a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.

Ex. Quickly and suddenly are adverbs.

Adjective + ly = adverb

Ex. Quick + ly = quickly	sudden + ly = suddenly
bad + ly = badly	careful + ly = carefully

y – ily

easyy = easily heavyy = heavily
