







- **Clive Staples Lewis** was a British novelist, poet, academic, [medievalist](#), literary critic, essayist, [lay theologian](#), broadcaster, lecturer, and [Christian apologist](#). He held academic positions at both [Oxford University](#)([Magdalen College](#), 1925–1954) and [Cambridge University](#) ([Magdalene College](#), 1954–1963). He is best known for his works of fiction, especially [\*The Chronicles of Narnia\*](#)



- Clive Staples Lewis was born in [Belfast](#), Ireland, on 29 November 1898.



Lewis was a prolific writer, and his circle of literary friends became an informal discussion society known as the "[Inklings](#)", including [J. R. R. Tolkien](#), [Nevill Coghill](#), [Lord David Cecil](#), [Charles Williams](#), [Owen Barfield](#) and his brother [Warren Lewis](#)
